2	For the purposes of this Act, the term—
3	(1) "Act of 1890" means the Act entitled "An
4	Act to increase the efficiency and reduce the expenses
5	of the Signal Corps of the Army, and to transfer the
6	Weather Bureau to the Department of Agriculture",
7	approved October 1, 1890 (26 Stat. 653);
8	(2) "Act of 1947" means the Act entitled "An
9	Act to define the functions and duties of the Coast
10	and Geodetic Survey, and for other purposes", ap-
11	proved August 6, 1947 (33 U.S.C. 883a et seq.);
12	(3) "Act of 1970" means the Act entitled "An
13	Act to clarify the status and benefits of commissioned
14	officers of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-
15	ministration, and for other purposes", approved De-
16	cember 31, 1970 (33 U.S.C. 857–1 et seq.);

TITLE I—ATMOSPHERIC, WEATH- ER, AND SATELLITE PRO- GRAMS

4 SEC. 101. NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE.

5 (a) OPERATIONS AND RESEARCH.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the Na-6 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry 7 8 out the operations and research duties of the National 9 Weather Service, \$458,131,000 for fiscal year 1998 and 10 \$451,074,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include mete-11 orological, hydrological, and oceanographic public 12 warnings and forecasts, as well as applied research in support of such warnings and forecasts. Of the amounts author-13 14 ized under this subsection for each of the fiscal years 1998 and 1999, \$3,600,000 shall be for the Tropical Prediction 15 Center/National Hurricane Center. 16

17 (b) Systems Acquisition.—(1) There are authorized 18 to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National 19 Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out the 20 public warning and forecast systems duties of the National 21 Weather Service, \$89,713,000 for fiscal year 1998 (includ-22 ing amounts as provided in subsection (c)) and \$74,453,000 23 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include the development, 24 acquisition, and implementation of major public warning 25 and forecast systems, including the upgrade of computer facilities. None of the funds authorized under this subsection
 shall be used for the purposes for which funds are authorized
 under subsection (f).

4 (2) Of the amounts authorized under paragraph (1),
5 \$39,591,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$39,887,000 for fiscal
6 year 1999 shall be for Next Generation Weather Radar
7 (NEXRAD) program management, operations, and mainte8 nance.

9 (3) Of the amounts authorized under paragraph (1), 10 \$11,377,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$11,224,000 for fiscal 11 year 1999 shall be for remaining system acquisition, pro-12 gram management, support contracts, logistic support, and 13 continued product improvement of NEXRAD systems.

(c) NEW NEXRAD INSTALLATIONS.—Of the amount
authorized under subsection (b)(1) for fiscal year 1998,
\$15,000,000 shall be for the acquisition and deployment of
NEXRAD systems—

18 (1) identified as necessary to prevent degrada-19 tion of weather service caused by gaps in radar cov-20 erage, in National Weather Service follow-up studies 21 to the Secretary's Report to Congress on Adequacy of 22 NEXRAD Coverage and Degradation of Weather 23 Services Under National Weather Service Moderniza-24 tion for 32 Areas of Concern, dated October 12, 1995; 25 and

(2) recommended and approved by the Secretary,
 including program management, facilities, operations, and
 maintenance through September 30, 1999.

4 (d) ASOS PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—Of the sums
5 authorized in subsection (b)(1), \$9,835,000 for fiscal year
6 1998 and \$9,942,000 for fiscal year 1999 are authorized
7 to be appropriated to the Secretary, for the acquisition and
8 deployment of—

9 (1) the Automated Surface Observing System 10 (ASOS) and related systems, including multisensor 11 and backup arrays for National Weather Service sites 12 at airports; and

13 (2) Automated Meteorological Observing System
14 and Remote Automated Meteorological Observing Sys15 tem replacement units;

16 and to cover all associated activities, including program17 management and operations and maintenance.

(e) COMPUTER FACILITY UPGRADES.—Of the sums authorized in subsection (b)(1), \$13,910,000 for fiscal year
1998 and \$13,400,000 for fiscal year 1999 are authorized
to be appropriated to the Secretary for—

(1) the continued lease and maintenance of the
Cray C-90 supercomputer; and

24 (2) the Upgrade of the Central Computer Facil25 ity (to provide for payment toward the Cray J-916

systems buyout, to complete the National Weather
 Service telecommunications gateway upgrade, and to
 cover all associated activities, including program
 management and operations and maintenance).

(f) AWIPS PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—(1) There are *to* be authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to en-*able* the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration *to* carry out the acquisition, deployment, program manage-*ment*, operation, and maintenance of the Advanced Weather
Interactive Processing System (AWIPS), \$116,910,000 for *fiscal year 1998 and \$82,029,000 for fiscal year 1999.*

12 (2)(A) Of the sums authorized in paragraph (1), except 13 as provided in paragraph (3), there are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary for all fiscal years beginning 14 15 after September 30, 1997, an aggregate of \$186,300,000, to remain available until expended, to complete the acquisi-16 tion and deployment of AWIPS and NOAAPort and to 17 18 cover all associated activities, including program manage-19 ment and operations and maintenance through September 20 30, 1999.

(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), \$22,635,000
of the amount described in subparagraph (A) for fiscal year
1998 shall be derived from the use of unobligated prior year
funds appropriated for the Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite program.

1	(3) No funds are authorized to be appropriated for any
2	fiscal year under paragraph (1) unless, within 60 days
3	after the submission of the President's budget request for
4	such fiscal year, the Secretary—
5	(A) certifies to the Congress that—
6	(i) the systems meet the technical perform-
7	ance specifications included in the system con-
8	tract as in effect on August 11, 1995;
9	(ii) the systems can be fully deployed, sited,
10	and operational without requiring further ap-
11	propriations beyond amounts authorized under
12	paragraph (1); and
13	(iii) the Secretary does not foresee any
14	delays in the systems deployment and operations
15	schedule; or
16	(B) submits to the Congress a report which de-
17	scribes—
18	(i) the circumstances which prevent a cer-
19	tification under subparagraph (A);
20	(ii) remedial actions undertaken or to be
21	undertaken with respect to such circumstances;
22	(iii) the effects of such circumstances on the
23	systems deployment and operations schedule and
24	systems coverage; and

1	(iv) a justification for proceeding	with	the
2	program, if appropriate.		

CONSTRUCTION OF WEATHER FORECAST OF-3 (q)FICES.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-4 5 retary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out construction, repair, and modi-6 fication activities relating to new and existing weather fore-7 8 cast offices, \$13,823,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$8,189,000 9 for fiscal year 1999. Such activities include planning, de-10 sign, and land acquisition related to such offices.

(h) NATIONAL CENTERS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PREDICTION RESTRUCTURING.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National Oceanic
and Atmospheric Administration to carry out restructuring
of the National Meteorological Center into the National
Centers for Environmental Prediction, \$700,000 for fiscal
year 1998 and \$809,000 for fiscal year 1999.

(i) FACILITIES.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National Oceanic and
Atmospheric Administration to carry out NEXRAD Weather Service Office maintenance, \$2,950,000 for fiscal year
1998 and \$2,950,000 for fiscal year 1999.

(j) WEATHER SERVICE MODERNIZATION.—The Weather Service Modernization Act (15 U.S.C. 313 note) is
amended—

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1 (1) in section 706—

2 (A) by amending subsection (b) to read as
3 follows:

"(b) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary may not close, 4 automate, or relocate any field office unless the Secretary 5 has certified to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and 6 7 Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on Science 8 of the House of Representatives that such action will not 9 result in degradation of service to the affected area. Such 10 certification shall be in accordance with the modernization criteria established under section 704."; 11

12 (B) by striking subsections (c), (d), (e), and 13 (f); and

14 (C) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol15 lowing new subsections:

"(c) Special Circumstances.—The Secretary may 16 not close or relocate any field office which is located at an 17 airport, if the Secretary, in consultation with the Secretary 18 19 of Transportation and the Committee, determines as a result of the Air Safety Appraisal, completed and signed by 20 21 the National Weather Service and the Federal Aviation Ad-22 ministration on December 9, 1996, that such action will 23 result in degradation of service that affects aircraft safety.

"(d) PUBLIC LIAISON.—The Secretary shall maintain
for a period of at least two years after the closure of any
weather office a program to—
"(1) provide timely information regarding the
activities of the National Weather Service which may
affect service to the community, including moderniza-
tion and restructuring; and
"(2) work with area weather service users, in-
cluding persons associated with general aviation, civil
defense, emergency preparedness, and the news media,
with respect to the provision of timely weather
warnings and forecasts."; and
(2) in section 707—
(A) by amending subsection (c) to read as
follows:
"(c) DUTIES.—The Committee shall advise the Con-
gress and the Secretary on—
"(1) the implementation of the Strategic Plan,
annual development of the Plan, and establishment
and implementation of modernization criteria; and
"(2) matters of public safety and the provision
of weather services which relate to the comprehensive
modernization of the National Weather Service."; and
(B) by amending subsection (f) to read as

3 "(2) 90 days after the deadline for public com4 ment on the modernization criteria for closure certifi5 cation published in the Federal Register pursuant to
6 section 704(b)(2),

7 whichever occurs later.".

(k) BI-AGENCY WORKING GROUP.—The National 8 9 Weather Service is encouraged to follow through on the recommendation contained in the document entitled "Sec-10 retary's Report to Congress on Adequacy of NEXRAD Cov-11 erage and Degradation of Weather Services Under National 12 Weather Service Modernization for 32 Areas of Concern", 13 dated October 12, 1995, to initiate a dialogue with the Fed-14 15 eral Aviation Administration to form a bi-agency working group to assess further the potential for National Weather 16 Service operational use of Federal Aviation Administration 17 weather radar data, and to define engineering consider-18 ations that would be involved in implementing a data-shar-19 ing link between the Federal Aviation Administration and 20 the National Weather Service. 21

(1) NEXRAD OPERATIONAL AVAILABILITY AND RELIABILITY.—(1) The Secretary of Defense, in conjunction with
the Administrator, shall take steps to ensure that
NEXRADs operated by the Department of Defense that pro-

vide primary detection coverage over a portion of their
 ranges function as fully committed, reliable elements of the
 National Weather Radar Network, operating with the same
 standards, quality, and availability as the National Weath er Service-operated NEXRADs.

6 (2) NEXRADs operated by the Department of Defense
7 that provide primary detection coverage over a portion of
8 their ranges are to be considered as integral parts of the
9 National Weather Radar Network.

10 SEC. 102. ATMOSPHERIC RESEARCH.

11 (a) CLIMATE AND AIR QUALITY RESEARCH.—There 12 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to 13 carry out its climate and air quality research duties, 14 15 \$116,902,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$118,803,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include interannual and sea-16 sonal climate research, long-term climate and air quality 17 research, and high-performance computing and commu-18 19 nications.

(b) ATMOSPHERIC PROGRAMS.—There are authorized
to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out its
atmospheric research duties, \$43,456,000 for fiscal year
1998 and \$44,194,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include research for developing improved prediction capabili-

ties for atmospheric processes, as well as solar-terrestrial
 research and services.

3 (c) ACQUISITION OF DATA.—There are authorized to
4 be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National Oce5 anic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out data ac6 quisition activities of the Office of Oceanic and Atmospheric
7 Research, \$12,884,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$12,884,000
8 for fiscal year 1999.

9 (d) BOULDER LABORATORY ADMINISTRATIVE SUP-10 PORT CENTER.—There are authorized to be appropriated 11 to the Secretary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmos-12 pheric Administration to continue the modifications to the 13 Boulder Laboratory in Boulder, Colorado, to meet pro-14 grammatic requirements, \$1,900,000 for fiscal year 1998 15 and \$9,078,000 for fiscal year 1999.

16SEC. 103. NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL SATELLITE, DATA,17AND INFORMATION SERVICE.

18 (a) SATELLITE OBSERVING SYSTEMS.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the 19 20 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry 21 out its satellite observing systems duties, \$346,344,000 for 22 fiscal year 1998 (reduced by \$12,400,000) and \$522,255,000 23 for fiscal year 1999 (reduced by \$7,000,000), to remain 24 available until expended. Such duties include spacecraft procurement, launch, and associated ground station systems 25

involving polar orbiting and geostationary environmental
 satellites, as well as the operation of such satellites. None
 of the funds authorized under this subsection shall be used
 for the purposes for which funds are authorized under sec tion 105(d) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad ministration Authorization Act of 1992 (Public Law 102–
 567).

8 (b) POES PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—Of the sums 9 authorized in subsection (a), there are authorized to be ap-10 propriated to the Secretary \$82,905,000 for fiscal year 1998 11 and \$172,684,000 for fiscal year 1999, to remain available 12 until expended, for the procurement and launch of, and sup-13 porting ground systems for, Polar Orbiting Environmental 14 Satellites (POES), K, L, M, N, and N'.

15 NPOESS PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—Of the (c)sums authorized in subsection (a), there are authorized to 16 be appropriated to the Secretary, \$51,503,000 for fiscal 17 year 1998 and \$35,000,000 for fiscal year 1999, to remain 18 available until expended, for the procurement of the Na-19 20 tional Polar-Orbiting Operational Environmental Satellite 21 System (NPOESS), and the procurement and launch of, 22 and supporting ground systems for, such satellites.

23 (d) GOES N-Q.—Of the sums authorized in subsection
24 (a), there are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary
25 \$147,819,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$256,421,000 for fis-

cal year 1999 to procure up to three Geostationary Oper ational Environmental NEXT follow-on Satellites (GOES
 N-Q), instruments, launching, and supporting ground sys tems.

5 (e) OTHER PROGRAMS.—Of the sums authorized in 6 subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated to 7 the Secretary \$9,970,000 for fiscal year 1998 and 8 \$5,400,000 for fiscal year 1999, for the Wallops Island 9 backup, product development, and operating adjustment ac-10 tivities of the Geostationary Operational Environmental 11 Satellite program.

12 (f) OCEAN REMOTE SENSING.—Of the sums authorized 13 in subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated 14 to the Secretary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmos-15 pheric Administration to carry out ocean remote sensing 16 activities, \$3,800,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$3,800,000 17 for fiscal year 1999.

(g) ENVIRONMENTAL OBSERVING SERVICES.—Of the
sums authorized in subsection (a), there are authorized to
be appropriated to the Secretary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out Environmental Observing Services, \$50,347,000 for fiscal year
1998 and \$48,950,000 for fiscal year 1999.

24 (h) ENVIRONMENTAL DATA AND INFORMATION SERV25 ICES.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-

retary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad ministration to carry out its environmental data and infor mation services duties, \$43,835,000 for fiscal year 1998 and
 \$43,835,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include cli mate data services, geophysical data services, and environ mental assessment and information services.

8 SEC. 201. NATIONAL OCEAN SERVICE.

9 (a) NAVIGATION SERVICES.—

(1) MAPPING AND CHARTING.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the
National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to
carry out mapping and charting activities under the
Act of 1947 and any other law involving those activities, \$36,100,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$36,100,000
for fiscal year 1999.

(2) GEODESY.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry
out geodesy activities under the Act of 1947 and any
other law involving those activities, \$19,159,000 for
fiscal year 1998 and \$19,159,000 for fiscal year 1999.
(3) TIDE AND CURRENT DATA.—There are au-

thorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable
the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra-

1	tion to carry out tide and current observation activi-
2	ties under the Act of 1947 and any other law involv-
3	ing those activities, \$11,000,000 for fiscal year 1998
4	and \$11,187,000 for fiscal year 1999.
5	(b) Estuarine and Coastal Assessment.—
6	(1) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be ap-
7	propriated to the Secretary, to enable the National
8	Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to support
9	estuarine and coastal assessment activities under the
10	Act of 1947 and any other law involving those activi-
11	ties, \$2,674,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$2,719,000
12	for fiscal year 1999.
13	(2) OCEAN ASSESSMENT.—In addition to
14	amounts authorized under paragraph (1), there are
15	authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to en-
16	able the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-
17	tration to carry out the National Status and Trends
18	Program, the Strategic Environmental Assessment
19	Program, and the Hazardous Materials Response and
20	Assessment Program, \$28,425,000 for fiscal year 1998
21	and \$27,840,000 for fiscal year 1999.
22	(3) OIL POLLUTION ACT OF 1990.—In addition to
23	amounts authorized under paragraph (1), there are
24	authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to en-
25	able the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-

tration to carry out Oil Pollution Act of 1990 activi ties, \$1,000,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$1,017,000
 for fiscal year 1999.

4 (4) OCEAN SERVICES.—In addition to amounts 5 authorized under paragraph (1), there are authorized 6 to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the Na-7 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to 8 carry out ocean services duties, \$2,800,000 for fiscal 9 year 1998 and \$2,848,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such 10 duties include acquisition of sea-surface and ocean 11 temperature profiles from specially instrumented com-12 mercial vessels, and storing and archiving the ac-13 quired data.

(c) COASTAL OCEAN PROGRAM.—There are authorized
to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out the
Coastal Ocean Program, \$15,200,000 for fiscal year 1998
and \$15,458,000 for fiscal year 1999.

(d) Acquisition OF DATA.—There are authorized to
be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out data
acquisition activities of the National Ocean Service,
\$14,546,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$14,546,000 for fiscal
year 1999.

(a) MARINE PREDICTION RESEARCH.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the
National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry
out marine prediction research activities under the Act of
1947, the Act of 1890, and any other law involving those
activities, \$17,326,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$17,620,000
for fiscal year 1999.

9 (b) UNDERSEA RESEARCH PROGRAM.—

(1) AUTHORIZATION.—There are authorized to be
appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry
out the National Undersea Research Program,
\$5,400,000 for fiscal year 1998.

(2) PEER REVIEW.—No funds appropriated pursuant to this Act may be obligated for any grant unless such grant is competitively awarded and subject
to a peer review process established pursuant to the
plan submitted under paragraph (3).

20 (3) RESTRUCTURING PLAN.—By January 15,
21 1998, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on
22 Science of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of
24 the Senate a plan for carrying out the National Un25 dersea Research Program which includes the National
26 Undersea Research Advisory Council and the Na•HR 1278 RH

1 tional Undersea Research Peer Review Panel which
2 will ensure the quality of scientific research carried
3 out by the Program, the responsiveness of the Pro4 gram to the mission needs of the National Oceanic
5 and Atmospheric Administration, and responsiveness
6 of the Program to key national needs in oceano7 graphic research.

7 Data Buoy Center; or for information leading to the discov8 ery of missing National Weather Service property or the
9 recovery thereof.

10 SEC. 502. DUTIES OF THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE.

(a) IN GENERAL.—To protect life and property and
enhance the national economy, the Secretary, through the
National Weather Service, except as outlined in subsection
(b), shall be responsible for—

 16 source of weather and flood warnings;

(b) COMPETITION WITH PRIVATE SECTOR.—The National Weather Service shall not compete, or assist other entities to compete, with the private sector when a service not

specified in subsection (a) is currently provided or can be
 provided by commercial enterprise, unless the Secretary
 finds that the private sector is unwilling or unable to pro vide the services.

18 SEC. 503. MARINE SERVICES.

(a) SERVICE CONTRACTS.—Notwithstanding any other
provision of law and subject to the availability of appropriations, the Secretary shall enter into contracts, including
multiyear contracts, subject to subsection (c), for the use of
vessels to conduct oceanographic research and fisheries research, monitoring, enforcement, and management, and to
acquire other data necessary to carry out the missions of

2	Secretary shall enter into these contracts unless—

19	States Code, the Secretary may acquire data under
20	multiyear contracts.
21	(2) REQUIRED FINDINGS.—The Secretary may
22	not enter into a contract pursuant to this subsection
23	unless the Secretary finds with respect to that con-
24	tract that there is a reasonable expectation that
25	throughout the contemplated contract period the Sec-

1	retary will request from Congress funding for the con-
2	tract at the level required to avoid contract termi-
3	nation.
4	(3) REQUIRED PROVISIONS.—The Secretary may
5	not enter into a contract pursuant to this subsection

14 SEC. 505. LIMITATIONS.

15 (a) PROHIBITION OF LOBBYING ACTIVITIES.—None of the funds authorized by this Act shall be available for any 16 activity whose purpose is to influence legislation pending 17 before the Congress, except that this subsection shall not pre-18 vent officers or employees of the United States or of its de-19 partments or agencies from communicating to Members of 20 21 Congress on the request of any Member or to Congress, 22 through the proper channels, requests for legislation or ap-23 propriations which they deem necessary for the efficient 24 conduct of the public business.

(b) LIMITATION ON APPROPRIATIONS.—No sums are

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall ex-8 clude from consideration for grant agreements made 9 by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-10 tration after fiscal year 1997 any person who received 11 funds, other than those described in paragraph (2), 12 appropriated for a fiscal year after fiscal year 1997, 13 under a grant agreement from any Federal funding 14 source for a project that was not subjected to a com-15 petitive, merit-based award process. Any exclusion 16 from consideration pursuant to this subsection shall 17 be effective for a period of 5 years after the person re-18 ceives such Federal funds.

19 (2) EXCEPTION.—Paragraph (1) shall not apply
20 to the receipt of Federal funds by a person due to the
21 membership of that person in a class specified by law
22 for which assistance is awarded to members of the
23 class according to a formula provided by law.

13	3710a(d)(1))).

14 SEC. 506. NOTICE.

15 (a) NOTICE OF REPROGRAMMING.—If any funds au-16 thorized by this Act are subject to a reprogramming action 17 that requires notice to be provided to the Appropriations Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate, 18 19 notice of such action shall concurrently be provided to the 20 Committees on Science and Resources of the House of Rep-21 resentatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and 22 Transportation of the Senate.

(b) NOTICE OF REORGANIZATION.—The Administrator
shall provide notice to the Committees on Science, Resources, and Appropriations of the House of Representa-

1 tives, and the Committees on Commerce, Science, and Transportation and Appropriations of the Senate, not later than 15 days before any major reorganization of any program, project, or activity of the National Oceanic and At-

6 SEC. 507. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON THE YEAR 2000 PROB-7 LEM.

8 With the year 2000 fast approaching, it is the sense of Congress that the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-9 ministration should— 10

(f) AWIPS PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—(1) 4 There are to be authorized to be appropriated 5 to the Secretary to enable the National Oce-6 anic and Atmospheric Administration to carry 7 8 out the acquisition, deployment, program management, operation, and maintenance of 9 10 the Advanced Weather Interactive Processing System (AWIPS), \$116,910,000 for fiscal year 11 1998 and \$82,029,000 for fiscal year 1999. 12

8 appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the
9 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis10 tration to carry out NEXRAD Weather Service
11 Office maintenance, \$2,950,000 for fiscal year
12 1998 and \$2,950,000 for fiscal year 1999.

(j) WEATHER SERVICE MODERNIZATION.—
14 The Weather Service Modernization Act (15
15 U.S.C. 313 note) is amended—

- 16 (1) in section 706—
- 17 (A) by amending subsection (b) to
 18 read as follows:

19 "(b) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary may 20 not close, automate, or relocate any field of-21 fice unless the Secretary has certified to the 22 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Trans-23 portation of the Senate and the Committee on 24 Science of the House of Representatives that 25 such action will not result in degradation of

4 (b) ATMOSPHERIC PROGRAMS.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-5 retary to enable the National Oceanic and At-6 7 mospheric Administration to carry out its at-8 mospheric research duties, \$43,456,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$44,194,000 for fiscal year 9 1999. Such duties include research for devel-10 oping improved prediction capabilities for at-11 12 mospheric processes, as well as solar-terrestrial research and services. 13

14 (c) BOULDER LABORATORY ADMINISTRATIVE 15 SUPPORT CENTER.—There are authorized to be 16 appropriated to the Secretary to enable the 17 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-18 tration to continue the modifications to the 19 Boulder Laboratory in Boulder, Colorado, to 20 meet programmatic requirements, \$1,900,000 21 for fiscal year 1998 and \$9,078,000 for fiscal 22 year 1999. 2 AND INFORMATION SERVICE.

3 (a) SATELLITE OBSERVING SYSTEMS.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-4 5 retary to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out its sat-6 ellite observing systems duties, \$342,544,000 7 for fiscal year 1998 (reduced by \$12,400,000) 8 and \$518,455,000 for fiscal year 1999 (reduced 9 10 by \$7,000,000), to remain available until ex-11 pended. Such duties include spacecraft pro-12 curement, launch, and associated ground sta-13 tion systems involving polar orbiting and geo-14 stationary environmental satellites, as well as 15 the operation of such satellites. None of the 16 funds authorized under this subsection shall 17 be used for the purposes for which funds are 18 authorized under section 105(d) of the Na-19 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra-20 tion Authorization Act of 1992 (Public Law 102-567). 21

(b) POES PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—Of
the sums authorized in subsection (a), there
are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary \$82,905,000 for fiscal year 1998 and
\$172,684,000 for fiscal year 1999, to remain
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available until expended, for the procurement
 and launch of, and supporting ground sys tems for, Polar Orbiting Environmental Sat ellites (POES), K, L, M, N, and N'.

5 (c) NPOESS PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION.—Of 6 the sums authorized in subsection (a), there 7 are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-8 retary, \$51,503,000 for fiscal year 1998 and 9 \$35,000,000 for fiscal year 1999, to remain 10 available until expended, for the procurement 11 of the National Polar-Orbiting Operational 12 Environmental Satellite System (NPOESS), 13 and the procurement and launch of, and sup-14 porting ground systems for, such satellites.

(d) GOES N-Q.—Of the sums authorized in
subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary \$147,819,000 for
fiscal year 1998 and \$256,421,000 for fiscal
year 1999 to procure up to three Geostationary Operational Environmental NEXT
follow-on Satellites (GOES N-Q), instruments,
launching, and supporting ground systems.

(e) OTHER PROGRAMS.—Of the sums authorized in subsection (a), there are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary

\$9,970,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$5,400,000
 for fiscal year 1999, for the Wallops Island
 backup, product development, and operating
 adjustment activities of the Geostationary
 Operational Environmental Satellite pro gram.

7 (f) ENVIRONMENTAL OBSERVING SERVICES.— 8 Of the sums authorized in subsection (a), 9 there are authorized to be appropriated to the 10 Secretary to enable the National Oceanic and 11 Atmospheric Administration to carry out En-12 vironmental Observing Services, \$50,347,000 13 for fiscal year 1998 and \$48,950,000 for fiscal 14 year 1999.

15 (g) ENVIRONMENTAL DATA AND INFORMATION 16 SERVICES.—There are authorized to be appro-17 priated to the Secretary to enable the Na-18 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra-19 tion to carry out its environmental data and 20 information services duties, \$43,835,000 for 21 fiscal year 1998 and \$43,835,000 for fiscal year 22 1999. Such duties include climate data serv-23 ices, geophysical data services, and environ-24 mental assessment and information services.

3 SEC. 201. OCEANOGRAPHY AND MARINE RESEARCH.

(a) COASTAL OCEAN PROGRAM.—There are 4 authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-5 retary, to enable the National Oceanic and At-6 mospheric Administration to carry out the 7 Coastal Ocean Program, \$15,200,000 for fiscal 8 year 1998 and \$15,458,000 for fiscal year 1999. 9 10 (b) ACQUISITION OF DATA.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary 11 12 to enable the National Oceanic and Atmos-13 pheric Administration to carry out data ac-14 quisition activities of the Office of Oceanic and Atmospheric Research, \$15,400,000 for fis-15 16 cal year 1998 and \$15,700,000 for fiscal year 17 1999.

(c) OCEAN REMOTE SENSING.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary
to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out ocean remote sensing activities, \$3,800,000 for fiscal
year 1998 and \$3,800,000 for fiscal year 1999.
(d) OCEANOGRAPHY AND MARINE PREDICTION RESEARCH.—There are authorized to

be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to carry out marine prediction research activities under the Act of 1890, and any other law involving those activities, \$19,851,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$19,851,000 for fiscal year 1999.

8 (e) ARCTIC RESEARCH.—There are author-9 ized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to 10 enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 11 Administration to carry out the Arctic re-12 search activities of the Office of Oceanic and 13 Atmospheric Research \$2,000,000 for each of 14 fiscal years 1998 and 1999.

15 (f) UNDERSEA RESEARCH PROGRAM.—

AUTHORIZATION.—There 16 (1) are au-17 thorized to be appropriated to the Sec-18 retary, to enable the National Oceanic 19 and Atmospheric Administration to carry 20 out the National Undersea Research Pro-21 gram, \$18,000,000 for each of fiscal years 22 1998 and 1999.

(2) PEER REVIEW.—No funds appropriated pursuant to this Act may be obligated for any research grant unless such

grant is competitively awarded and sub ject to a peer review process established
 pursuant to the plan submitted under
 paragraph (3).

(3) **RESTRUCTURING PLAN.**—By January 5 15, 1998, the Secretary shall submit to the 6 7 **Committees on Resources and Science of** the House of Representatives and the 8 Committee on Commerce, Science, and 9 10 Transportation of the Senate a plan for 11 carrying out the National Undersea Re-12 search Program that will ensure the quality of scientific research carried out by 13 the Program, the responsiveness of the 14 Program to the mission needs of the Na-15 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-16 17 tration, and responsiveness of the Pro-18 gram to key national needs in oceano-19 graphic research.

20 (g) OCEAN SERVICES.—There are author-21 ized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to 22 enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 23 Administration to carry out ocean services 24 duties, \$2,800,000 for fiscal year 1998 and 25 \$2,848,000 for fiscal year 1999. Such duties include acquisition of sea-surface and ocean
 temperature profiles from specially instru mented commercial vessels, and storing and
 archiving the acquired data.

5 (h) NATIONAL OCEANOGRAPHIC PARTNER-6 SHIP PROGRAM.—The National Oceanic and At-7 mospheric Administration is authorized to 8 participate in the National Oceanic Partner-9 ship Program established by the National 10 Oceanic Partnership Act (Public Law 104-11 201).

12 TITLE III—PROGRAM SUPPORT 13 AND OTHER ACCOUNTS

14 SEC. 301. PROGRAM SUPPORT.

15 (a) EXECUTIVE DIRECTION AND ADMINISTRA-16 TIVE ACTIVITIES.—There are authorized to be 17 appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the 18 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-19 tration to carry out executive direction and 20 administrative activities under the Act of 21 1970 and any other law involving those activi-22 ties, \$18,240,000 for fiscal year 1998 and 23 \$17,328,000 for fiscal year 1999.

24 (b) SYSTEMS ACQUISITION OFFICE.—There 25 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to enable the National Oceanic and At mospheric Administration to carry out Sys tems Acquisition Office activities, \$1,423,000
 for fiscal year 1998 and \$1,351,000 for fiscal
 year 1999.

6 (c) CENTRAL ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT.— 7 There are authorized to be appropriated to 8 the Secretary, to enable the National Oceanic 9 and Atmospheric Administration to carry out 10 central administrative support activities 11 under the Act of 1970 and any other law in-12 volving those activities, \$31,350,000 for fiscal 13 year 1998 and \$29,783,000 for fiscal year 1999.

(d) AIRCRAFT SERVICES.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary, to
enable the National Oceanic and Atmospheric
Administration to carry out aircraft services
activities (including aircraft operations,
maintenance, and support) under the Act of
1970 and any other law involving those activities, \$9,900,000 for fiscal year 1998 and
\$9,900,000 for fiscal year 1999.

23 SEC. 302. RECOVERIES FROM PRIOR YEARS.

The total amount authorized to be appropriated pursuant to title I is reduced by \$25,500,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$14,000,000
 for fiscal year 1999 to reflect the use of prior
 year balances.

7 (a) PROGRAMS.—No funds are authorized
8 to be appropriated for the following programs

14 (3) National Institute for Environ15 mental Renewal.

16 (4) National Weather Service non17 Federal, non-wildfire Fire Weather Serv18 ice.

19 (5) National Weather Service Re20 gional Climate Centers.

21 (6) Goddard Science Center.

(7) National Weather Service Samoa
Weather Forecast Office Repair and Upgrade Account.

(b) REPORT.—Not later than 60 days after 1 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-2 retary shall submit to the Committee on 3 Science of the House of Representatives and 4 the Committee on Commerce, Science, and 5 Transportation of the Senate a report certify-6 ing that all the programs listed in subsection 7 8 (a) will be terminated no later than September 30, 1997. 9

10 SEC. 402. LIMITATIONS ON APPROPRIATIONS.

11 (a) MAXIMUM AMOUNTS; OPERATIONS, RE-FACILITIES.—No more 12 SEARCH, AND than \$1,039,206,000 for fiscal vear 1998 13 and 14 \$1,020,131,000 for fiscal year 1999 are author-15 ized to be appropriated to the Secretary by 16 title I of this Act to enable the National Oce-17 anic and Atmospheric Administration to carry 18 out all activities associated with Operations, Research, and Facilities for which funds are 19 authorized by this Act. 20

(b) MAXIMUM AMOUNTS; CAPITAL ASSETS ACQUISITION.—No more than \$410,808,000 for fiscal year 1998 and \$548,101,000 for fiscal year
1999 are authorized to be appropriated to the
Secretary by title I of this Act to enable the

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis tration to carry out all activities associated
 with Capital Assets Acquisition for which
 funds are authorized by this Act.

5 TITLE V—MISCELLANEOUS

6 SEC. 501. WEATHER DATA BUOYS.

7 (a) PROHIBITION.—It shall be unlawful for 8 any unauthorized person to remove, change 9 the location of, obstruct, willfully damage, 10 make fast to, or interfere with any weather 11 data buoy established, installed, operated, or 12 maintained by the National Data Buoy Cen-13 ter.

14 (b) CIVIL PENALTIES.—The Administrator 15 is authorized to assess a civil penalty against 16 any person who violates any provision of this 17 section in an amount of not more than \$10,000 18 for each violation. Each day during which 19 such violation continues shall be considered 20 a new offense. Such penalties shall be as-21 sessed after notice and opportunity for a 22 hearing.

23 (c) REWARDS.—The Administrator may
24 offer and pay rewards for the apprehension
25 and conviction, or for information helpful

therein, of persons found interfering, in viola tion of law, with data buoys maintained by
 the National Data Buoy Center; or for infor mation leading to the discovery of missing Na tional Weather Service property or the recov ery thereof.

7 SEC. 502. DUTIES OF THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—To protect life and prop-9 erty and enhance the national economy, the 10 Secretary, through the National Weather 11 Service, except as outlined in subsection (b), 12 shall be responsible for—

13 (1) forecasts and shall serve as the
14 sole official source of weather and flood
15 warnings;

16 (2) the issue of storm warnings;

17 (3) the collection, exchange, and dis18 tribution of meteorological, hydrological,
19 climatic, and oceanographic data and in20 formation; and

21 (4) the preparation of
22 hydrometeorological guidance and core
23 forecast information.

24 (b) COMPETITION WITH PRIVATE SECTOR.—
25 The National Weather Service shall not com-

pete, or assist other entities to compete, with
 the private sector when a service not speci fied in subsection (a) is currently provided or
 can be provided by commercial enterprise,
 unless the Secretary finds that the private
 sector is unwilling or unable to provide the
 services.

8 (c) AMENDMENTS.—The Act of 1890 is 9 amended—

10 (1) by striking section 3 (15 U.S.C.
11 313); and

(2) in section 9 (15 U.S.C. 317), by
striking all after "Department of Agriculture" and inserting in lieu thereof a
period.

16 (d) REPORT.—Not later than 60 days after 17 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-18 retary shall submit to the Committee on 19 Science of the House of Representatives and 20 the Committee on Commerce, Science, and 21 Transportation of the Senate a report detail-22 ing all National Weather Service activities 23 which do not conform to the requirements of 24 this section and outlining a timetable for 25 their termination. 1 SEC. 503. PROHIBITION OF LOBBYING ACTIVITIES.

2 None of the funds authorized by this Act shall be available for any activity whose pur-3 pose is to influence legislation pending before 4 5 the Congress, except that this subsection shall 6 not prevent officers or employees of the United States or of its departments or agencies 7 8 from communicating to Members of Congress on the request of any Member or to Congress, 9 10 through the proper channels, requests for leg-11 islation or appropriations which they deem 12 necessary for the efficient conduct of the public business. 13

14 SEC. 504. NOTICE.

15 (a) NOTICE OF REPROGRAMMING.—If any 16 funds authorized by this Act are subject to a 17 reprogramming action that requires notice to 18 be provided to the Appropriations Commit-19 tees of the House of Representatives and the 20 Senate, notice of such action shall concur-21 rently be provided to the Committees on 22 Science and Resources of the House of Rep-23 resentatives and the Committee on Com-24 merce, Science, and Transportation of the 25 Senate.

(b) NOTICE OF REORGANIZATION.—The Ad-1 ministrator shall provide notice to the Com-2 mittees on Science, Resources, and Appro-3 4 priations of the House of Representatives, and the Committees on Commerce, Science, and 5 Transportation and Appropriations of the 6 Senate, not later than 15 days before any 7 8 major reorganization of any program, project, 9 or activity of the National Oceanic and Atmos-10 pheric Administration.

11SEC. 505. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON THE YEAR 2000 PROB-12LEM.

With the year 2000 fast approaching, it is the sense of Congress that the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration should—

(1) give high priority to correcting all
2-digit date-related problems in its computer systems to ensure that those systems continue to operate effectively in
the year 2000 and beyond;

(2) assess immediately the extent of
the risk to the operations of the National
Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration
posed by the problems referred to in

paragraph (1), and plan and budget for
 achieving Year 2000 compliance for all of
 its mission-critical systems; and

4 (3) develop contingency plans for
5 those systems that the National Oceanic
6 and Atmospheric Administration is un7 able to correct in time.

8 SEC. 506. BUY AMERICAN.

9 (a) COMPLIANCE WITH BUY AMERICAN ACT.— 10 No funds appropriated pursuant to this Act 11 may be expended by an entity unless the en-12 tity agrees that in expending the assistance 13 the entity will comply with sections 2 through 14 4 of the Act of March 3, 1933 (41 U.S.C. 10a-15 10c, popularly known as the "Buy American 16 Act").

17 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—In the case of 18 any equipment or products that may be au-19 thorized to be purchased with financial assist-20 ance provided under this Act, it is the sense 21 of Congress that entities receiving such as-22 sistance should, in expending the assistance, 23 purchase only American-made equipment and 24 products. (c) NOTICE TO RECIPIENTS OF ASSISTANCE.—
 In providing financial assistance under this
 Act, the Secretary of Commerce shall provide
 to each recipient of the assistance a notice de scribing the statement made in subsection (a)
 by the Congress.
