To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to repeal an exception to the terrorism-related ground for inadmissibility, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Importing Ter-
5 rorism Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF EXCEPTION TO TERRORISM-RELATED**
7 **GROUND OF INADMISSIBILITY.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Clause (ii) of section
9 212(a)(3)(B) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
10 U.S.C. 1182(a)(3)(B)) is repealed.

1 (b) DEPORTABILITY OF ALIENS ADMITTED PURSU-
2 ANT TO EXCEPTION.—Any alien who was admitted to the
3 United States pursuant to clause (ii) of section
4 212(a)(3)(B) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
5 U.S.C. 1182(a)(3)(B)) during the period beginning on
6 January 20, 2021, and ending on the date of enactment
7 of this Act, is deportable.
