Plan Colombia Semi-Annual Obligation Report & Andean Counterdrug Initiative Report 1st and 2nd Quarters, Fiscal Year 2002

In Division B of the Military Construction Appropriations Act, 2001 (P.L. 106-429) (the "Emergency Supplemental Act, 2000"), Congress appropriated \$1.3 billion in FY 2000 emergency supplemental funding to support counternarcotics activities associated with Plan Colombia. This funding included \$1.018 billion appropriated to the Department of State and \$300.6 million appropriated to the Department of Defense (DoD). Section 3204(e) of Public Law 106-246 requires the President to provide Congress with a semi-annual report setting forth an accounting of any costs incurred by any department, agency, or other entity of the Executive Branch during the two previous fiscal quarters in support of Plan Colombia. Further, Public Law (P.L.) 107-115 provided \$625 million in FY 2002 to the Department of State for the Andean Counterdrug Initiative (ACI), along with up to \$35 million authorized to be transferred to the ACI account from appropriations provided for International Narcotics Control and Law Enforcement. These resources principally provided follow-on support to Plan Colombia activities initiated with FY 2000 emergency appropriations. P.L. 106-246 requires the accounting of all funding being spent in support of Plan Colombia. Pursuant to this statutory requirement, the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) has prepared this Plan Colombia Semi-Annual Obligation Report, and Andean Counterdrug Initiative Report covering the first and second quarters of FY 2002.

In order to fulfill this reporting requirement, ONDCP has worked closely with the Departments of State and Defense, as well as the Office of Management and Budget, to develop an accounting report on spending in support of Plan Colombia. ONDCP's guidance to agencies for preparing input for this report carefully defines how obligations are displayed, in order to present Congress with the most accurate accounting of how budget resources have been executed. Of note is the convention employed to present spending data for the Department of State. Of the \$1.018 billion appropriated to State for Plan Colombia, all except \$10.977 million has been obligated in bilateral agreements with host governments, including the Government of Colombia. Some program elements supported with funds obligated under these bilateral agreements are being executed by the Department of State, through the "subobligation" (through actual commitments of funds in contracts, grants, and other procurement actions) of these funds. Other program elements supported with funds obligated under these bilateral agreements are being executed by other U.S. agencies, such as the Justice Department, under interagency transfer or allocation agreements with State. Accordingly, this report provides information on subobligations incurred by State for program elements directly executed by State, as well as amounts reported as subobligated by other agencies that received resources from State. As the accompanying report indicates, of the \$1.3 billion initially appropriated for Plan Colombia, \$1.1 billion, or 83 percent, had been subobligated as of March 31, 2002. Overall, this subobligation rate measures solid progress in implementing this initiative. Also, beginning with this reporting period, obligations incurred against the ACI account will be reported.

Funds Appropriated to State:

Of the \$1.018 billion appropriated to the Department of State for Plan Colombia, \$823.7 million had been subobligated as of March 31, 2002. In one area, Support for Human Rights and Judicial Reform, subobligations during the first half of FY 2002 continue to fall below the average rate of subobligations for other activities in support of Plan Colombia. Through March 31, \$59.9 million, or 49 percent of the funding allocated for projects relating to Support for Human Rights and Judicial Reform had been subobligated. Of the \$74.8 million being executed by the Department of Justice (DOJ) through a transfer or allocation agreement with the Department of State, only \$28.8 million had been obligated as of March 31, 2002. As originally planned, the Justice Sector Reform Program funds administered by DOJ will be obligated over a two year period. The total obligated balance for the reporting period (\$28.8 million) should increase significantly by the end of the next reporting period (9/30/02). As of June 30, 2002, total obligations have increased by approximately \$11 million. The total obligated balance should increase further as a result of multi-million dollar procurement actions that are expected to be awarded in the Witness Protection/Judicial Security area. In addition, as a result of the successful completion of a thorough review and analysis of the Automated Fingerprint Identification System component in the Human Rights area, DOJ is in a position to move forward to full implementation and fielding of this important multi-million dollar project.

For some Plan Colombia line items, subobligation figures may not be consistent with prior reports. For example, the United States Agency for International Development's (USAID) financial management system records data at the strategic objective level, not at the level of the individual lines of the supplemental appropriations. USAID has developed a methodology to disaggregate subobligations tracked in its accounting system to the line item level of detail associated with individual Plan Colombia projects. This manual process may produce minor inconsistencies by line item across reporting periods. Further, for projects implemented by the Department of State, tracking subobligations by quarter is also a manual process and may produce minor inconsistencies by line item across reporting periods. The data included in this report for all agencies represent the best approximation of subobligations by line item that is available.

As of March 31, 2002, the Department of State and United States Agency for International Development had obligated \$7.2 million of the \$645 million provided to the ACI account for Fiscal Year 2002. Given the timing of appropriation action, funding was not available for obligation until mid-March of this year for the ACI account.

Funds Appropriated to Defense:

Of the \$300.6 million appropriated to the DoD under Division B of Public Law 106-246, \$270.5 million had been obligated as of March 31, 2002. Included in this report is a realignment of \$580,000 of excess funding from the initial training of the CD Battalions to the Schweitzer Aircraft Contract Logistics Support.

The Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the Conference Report to Public Law 106-246 (H.R. Conf. Rept. 106-710), recommended that \$116.523 million appropriated to the DoD for military construction be provided for three Forward Operating Locations (FOLs) in Ecuador, Aruba, and Curacao. In October 2001, the Dutch Parliament (Upper House) voted to approve the Aruba/Curacao Forward Operation Location package. However, the FY 2002 Military Construction Appropriations Act (P.L. 107-64) rescinded the FY 2000 emergency funding that the DoD had planned to use for the FOL in Aruba, and the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2002 (P.L. 107-107, section 2408) clearly identified that none of the FY 2000 emergency funding may be used by Secretary of Defense to develop any Forward Operation Location on the island of Aruba. The Administration continues to consider the operational impacts of this decision and whether to request authorization and appropriations from Congress to complete the FOL construction.

Ultimately, subobligations for each program element will be equal to the overall amount of funds obligated under bilateral agreements with the host governments.

^{2.} The following programs include adjustments to obligations to correct the prior reporting period: Protection of Human Rights; Strenthen Human Rights Institutions; Criminal Code Reform; Judges Training; Casa de Justicia Judicial Training; Public Defender Program; Asset Forfeiture-Money-Laundering Task Force; Conflict Management and Peace Process; Rehabilitation of Child Soldiers; Community-Level Alternative Development; Assistance to Local Governments; and Assistance for Internally Displaced Persons. Adjustments reflect actual signed contracts by the United States Agency for International Development as opposed to obligations into strategic objective agreements.
