### Chamber Action

**Public Bills and Resolutions Introduced:** 11 public bills, H.R. 6008–6018; 1 private bill, H.R. 6019; and 4 resolutions, H. Res. 801–804, were introduced. **Page H5038**

**Reports Filed:** There were no reports filed today.

**Guest Chaplain:** The prayer was offered by the Guest Chaplain, Reverend Ryan Coffey, First Baptist Church, Somerset, Kentucky. **Page H5035**

**Call of the House:** Pursuant to clause 7 of rule XX, Representative Johnson (LA) moved a call of the House. Accordingly, Members were counted and the Chair announced that 427 Members being counted, a quorum was present, Roll No. 524. **Page H5035**

**Election of Speaker:** The House conducted one vote to elect a Speaker, from which a majority of 218 was not ascertained, therefore a Speaker was not elected. During the vote for Speaker, the Honorable Hakeem Jeffries received 210 votes, the Honorable Jim Jordan received 194 votes, the Honorable Steve Scalise received 8 votes, the Honorable Patrick McHenry received 6 votes, the Honorable Lee Zeldin received 4 votes, the Honorable Kevin McCarthy received 2 votes, the Honorable Byron Donalds received 2 votes, the Honorable Mike Garcia (CA) received 1 vote, the Honorable Tom Emmer received 1 vote, and the Honorable Bruce Westerman received 1 vote, Roll No. 525. On Tuesday, October 17th, the Chair appointed Representatives Steil, Morelle,

Loudermilk, and Sewell to act as Tellers. Additional proceedings are expected next week. **Pages H5036–38**

### Committee Meetings

#### MISCELLANEOUS MEASURES

**Committee on Foreign Affairs:** On October 19, 2023, Full Committee held a markup on H. Res. 559, declaring it is the policy of the United States that a nuclear Islamic Republic of Iran is not acceptable; H.R. 340, to impose sanctions with respect to foreign support for terrorist organizations, including Hamas and the Palestinian Islamic Jihad; H.R. 3266, to require the Secretary of State to submit annual reports reviewing the curriculum used by the Palestinian Authority, and for other purposes; H.R. 3774, to impose additional sanctions with respect to the importation or facilitation of the importation of petroleum products from Iran, and for other purposes; H.R. 5826, to require a report on sanctions under the Robert Levinson Hostage Recovery and Hostage-Taking Accountability Act, and for other

purposes; H.R. 2973, to require the Secretary of Defense to develop, in cooperation with allies and partners in the Middle East, an integrated maritime domain awareness and interdiction capability, and for other purposes; H. Res. 599, urging the European Union to designate Hizballah in its entirety as a terrorist organization; and H.R. 1809, to require the development of strategies and options to prevent the export to Iran of certain technologies related to unmanned aircraft systems, and for other purposes. H. Res. 559, H.R. 3266, and H. Res. 599 were ordered reported, without amendment. H.R. 2973, H.R. 5826, H.R. 340, H.R. 3774, and H.R. 1809 were ordered reported, as amended.
