Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows: H.R. 8812, to provide for improvements to the rivers and harbors of the United States, to provide for the conservation and development of water and related resources, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–587);

H.R. 6864, to amend the Department of Housing and Urban Development Act to require the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to testify on an annual basis before the Congress, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–588);

H.R. 7462, to require the Government Accountability Office to conduct a study regarding insurance coverage for damages from wildfires, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–589);

H.R. 7156, to expand the investigative authorities of the United States Secret Service, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–590, Part 1);
