**Public Bills and Resolutions Introduced:** 33 public bills, H.R. 9714–9746; and 7 resolutions, H.J. Res. 207; and H. Res. 1479–1484, were introduced.

**Reports Filed:** Reports were filed today as follows:

H.R. 8932, to establish an earlier application processing cycle for the FAFSA, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–695);

H.R. 9488, to amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to require the disclosure of the card verification value as a condition of the acceptance of online contributions made through the use of credit or debit cards in elections for Federal office and to prohibit the acceptance of contributions made through the use of gift cards and prepaid credit cards in such elections, and for other purposes, with amendments (H. Rept. 118–696);

H.R. 8108, to amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to add a Medicaid State plan requirement with respect to the determination of residency of certain individuals serving in the Armed Forces, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–697);

H.R. 8610, to reauthorize and reform counter-unmanned aircraft system authorities, to improve transparency, security, safety, and accountability related to such authorities, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–698, Part 1);

H.R. 7073, to improve public-private partnerships and increase Federal research, development, and demonstration related to the evolution of next gen-

eration pipeline systems, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–699); and

H.R. 3433, to amend the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act with respect to molecularly targeted pediatric cancer investigations, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–700).

**No Bailout for Sanctuary Cities Act:** The House passed H.R. 5717, to provide that sanctuary jurisdictions that provide benefits to aliens who are present in the United States without lawful status under the immigration laws are ineligible for Federal funds intended to benefit such aliens, by a yea-and-nay vote of 219 yeas to 186 nays, Roll No. 437. Consideration began yesterday, September 19th.

H. Res. 1455, the rule providing for consideration of the bills (H.R. 3724), (H.R. 4790), (H.R. 5179), (H.R. 5339), (H.R. 5717), and (H.R. 7909) and the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 136) was agreed to Wednesday, September 18th.

**Suspension—Proceedings Resumed**: The House agreed to suspend the rules and pass the following measure. Consideration began Thursday, September 19th.

**Enhanced Presidential Security Act of 2024**: H.R. 9106, amended, to direct the Director of the United States Secret Service to apply the same standards for determining the number of agents required to protect Presidents, Vice Presidents, and major Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates, by a 2/3 yeand-nay vote of 405 yeas with none voting “nay”, Roll No. 439.

**Expanding the jurisdiction of the Task Force on the Attempted Assassination of Donald J. Trump**: The House agreed to discharge from committee and agree to H. Res. 1470, expanding the jurisdiction of the Task Force on the Attempted Assassination of Donald J. Trump.
