Reports Filed: Reports were filed today as follows:

H.R. 7409, to amend the Geothermal Steam Act of 1970 to waive the requirement for a Federal drilling permit for certain activities, to exempt certain activities from the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 118–722);

H.R. 8446, to amend the Energy Act of 2020 to include critical materials in the definition of critical mineral, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–723);

H.R. 4551, to prohibit the Securities and Exchange Commission from requiring that personally identifiable information be collected under consolidated audit trail reporting requirements, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–724);

H.R. 4206, to amend the Financial Stability Act of 2010 to require covered financial institutions to include elements of accumulated other comprehensive income when calculating capital for purposes of meeting capital requirements, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–725);

H.R. 8340, to amend section 3(b)(4) of the United States Housing Act of 1937 to exclude certain disability benefits from income for the purposes of determining eligibility for the supported housing

program under section 8(0)(19), and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–726);

H.J. Res. 100, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Securities and Exchange Commission relating to “Cybersecurity Risk Management, Strategy, Governance and Incident Disclosure” (H. Rept. 118–727); and

H.R. 7437, to require certain supervisory agencies to assess their technological vulnerabilities, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 118–728). **Pages H5906–07**
