SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of S.J. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the joint resolution. The resolution provides that the joint resolution shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the joint resolution. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Financial Services or their respective designees. The resolution provides for one motion to commit. The resolution further provides for consideration of S.J. Res. 28, Disapproving the rule submitted by the Bureau of Consumer Financial

Protection relating to “Defining Larger Participants of a Market for General-Use Digital Consumer Payment Applications”, under a closed rule. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the joint resolution. The resolution provides that the joint resolution shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the bill shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on House Administration or their respective designees. The resolution provides for one motion to recommit. The resolution further provides that House Resolution 293 is hereby adopted. The resolution provides that House Resolution 164 is laid on the table.
