

E. Unfunded Mandates Reform Act

The Unfunded Mandates Reform Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1531–1538) requires Federal agencies to assess the effects of their discretionary regulatory actions. In particular, the Act addresses actions that may result in the expenditure by a State, local, or tribal government, in the aggregate, or by the private sector of \$100,000,000 (adjusted for inflation) or more in any one year. Though this rule will not result in such an expenditure, we do discuss the effects of this rule elsewhere in this preamble.

F. Environment

We have analyzed this rule under Department of Homeland Security Directive 023–01, and Environmental Planning, COMDTINST 5090.1 (series), which guide the Coast Guard in complying with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321–4370f) and have determined that this action is one of a category of actions that do not individually or cumulatively have a significant effect on the human environment. This rule involves establishment of a temporary safety zone for navigable waters of the Laguna Madre in a zone defined by a 700-yard radius around the fireworks barge, located at the following point: 26°06′02.1″ N, 97°10′17.7″ W. It is categorically excluded from further review under paragraph L60(a) of Appendix A, Table 1 of DHS Instruction Manual 023–01–001–01, Rev. 1. A Record of Environmental Consideration supporting this determination is available in the docket. For instructions on locating the docket, see the **ADDRESSES** section of this preamble.

G. Protest Activities

The Coast Guard respects the First Amendment rights of protesters. For the reasons discussed in the preamble, the Coast Guard amends 33 CFR part 165 as follows:

PART 165—REGULATED NAVIGATION AREAS AND LIMITED ACCESS AREAS

■ 1. The authority citation for part 165 continues to read as follows:

Authority: 46 U.S.C. 70034, 70051, 70124; 33 CFR 1.05–1, 6.04–1, 6.04–6, and 160.5; Department of Homeland Security Delegation No. 00170.1, Revision No. 01.3.

■ 2. Add § 165.T08–1009 to read as follows:

§ 165.T08–1009 Safety Zone; Corpus Christi Bay, Corpus Christi, TX.

(a) *Location.* The following area is a safety zone: all navigable waters of the Laguna Madre encompassed by a 700-yard radius around the fireworks barge, located at the following point: 26°06′02.1″ N, 97°10′17.7″ W.

(b) *Enforcement period.* This section is subject to enforcement from 9:30 p.m. through 11:59 p.m. on December 7, 2024.

(c) *Regulations.* (1) In accordance with the general regulations in subpart C of this part, entry into this temporary safety zone is prohibited unless authorized by the Captain of the Port Sector Corpus Christi (COTP) or a designated representative. They may be contacted on Channel 16 VHF–FM (156.8 MHz) or by telephone at 361–939–0450.

(2) If permission is granted, all persons and vessels shall comply with the instructions of the COTP or designated representative.

(d) *Information broadcasts.* The COTP or a designated representative will inform the public of the enforcement times and date for this safety zone through Broadcast Notices to Mariners and Safety Marine Information Broadcasts as appropriate.

Safety Zone; City of Rockport, Rockport Tropical Christmas Festival Fireworks Display Show

AGENCY: Coast Guard, DHS.

ACTION: Notification of enforcement of regulation.

SUMMARY: The Coast Guard will enforce the safety zone for the Rockport Tropical Christmas Festival Fireworks Display Show on December 6, 2024, or December 7, 2024, to provide for the safety of persons, vessels, and the marine environment on navigable waterways during this event. Our regulation for marine events within the Eighth Coast Guard District identifies the safety zone for this event in Rockport, TX. During the enforcement periods, entry into this zone is prohibited unless authorized by the Captain of the Port Sector Corpus Christi (COTP) or a designated representative.

DATES: The regulations in 33 CFR 165.801, Table 4, Line 11, will be enforced from 8 p.m. through 8:45 p.m. on December 6, 2024, unless the event is postponed because of adverse weather, in which case this rule will be enforced from 8 p.m. through 8:45 p.m. on December 7, 2024.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Coast Guard will enforce the safety zone in 33 CFR 165.801, Table 4, Line 11, for the Rockport Tropical Christmas Festival Fireworks Display Show from 8 p.m. through 8:45 p.m. on December 6, 2024, with a rain date set for December 7, 2024, from 8 p.m. through 8:45 p.m. This action is being taken to provide for the safety of persons, vessels, and the marine environment on navigable waterways during this event. Our regulation for marine events within the Eighth Coast Guard District, § 165.801, specifies the location of the safety zone for the Rockport Tropical Christmas Festival Fireworks Display Show, which encompasses portions of Little Bay in Rockport, TX. As reflected in § 165.23 and § 165.801(a), if you are the operator of a vessel in the regulated area you must comply with directions from the Captain of the Port Sector Corpus Christi (COTP) or any designated representative. Persons or vessels desiring to enter the zone must request permission from the COTP or a designated representative. They can be reached on VHF FM channel 16 or by telephone at (361) 939–0450.

If permission is granted, all persons and vessels shall comply with the instructions of the COTP or designated representative.

In addition to this notice of enforcement in the **Federal Register**, the COTP or a designated representative will inform the public through Broadcast Notice to Mariners (BNM) and Marine Safety Information Broadcasts (MSIBs) at least 24 hours in advance of each enforcement.

Cost of Living Adjustment to Royalty Rates and Terms for Making and Distributing Phonorecords

AGENCY: Copyright Royalty Board, Library of Congress.

ACTION: Final rule; cost of living adjustment.

SUMMARY: The Copyright Royalty Judges announce a cost of living adjustment (COLA) in the royalty rates for the statutory license for making and distributing phonorecords of nondramatic musical works regarding physical phonorecords and Permanent Downloads.

DATES:

Effective date: November 27, 2024.

Applicability date: These rates and terms are applicable during the period from January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Section 115 of the Copyright Act, title 17 of the United States Code, creates a statutory license for making and distributing phonorecords of nondramatic musical works. On December 16, 2022, the Copyright Royalty Judges (Judges) adopted final regulations governing the rates and terms of copyright royalty payments under that license for the license period 2024–2027 for making and distributing phonorecords of nondramatic musical works. See 87 FR 76942.

Pursuant to those regulations, at least 25 days before January 1 of each year, the Judges shall publish in the **Federal**

Register notice of a cost of living adjustment (COLA) applicable to the royalty fees for making and distributing physical phonorecords and Permanent Downloads. See 37 CFR 385.11.

The adjustment in the royalty fee shall be based on a calculation of the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) published in November 2022 (298.012)¹ (“base rate”) according to the following formulas: for the per-work rate, $(1 + (Cy - 298.012^2)/298.012) \times 12\%$, rounded to the nearest tenth of a cent; for the per-minute rate, $(1 + (Cy - 298.012)/298.012) \times 2.31\%$, rounded to the nearest hundredth of a cent; where Cy is the CPI-U published by the Secretary of Labor before December 1 of the preceding year. 37 CFR 385.11(a)(2). The CPI-U published by the Secretary of Labor from the most recent index published before December 1, 2024, is 315.664.³ Applying the formulas in 37 CFR 385.11(a)(2) results in an increase in the rates for 2025.

The adjusted rates for 2025 are 12.7 cents for the per-work rate and 2.45 cents for the per-minute rate.

Final Regulations

In consideration of the foregoing, the Judges amend part 385 of title 37 of the Code of Federal Regulations as follows:

PART 385—RATES AND TERMS FOR USE OF NONDRAMATIC MUSICAL WORKS IN THE MAKING AND DISTRIBUTING OF PHYSICAL AND DIGITAL PHONORECORDS

■ 1. The authority citation for part 385 continues to read as follows:

Authority: 17 U.S.C. 115, 801(b)(1), 804(b)(4).

■ 2. Section 385.11 is amended by revising paragraph (a)(1) to read as follows:

§ 385.11 Royalty fees for the public performance of sound recordings and the making of ephemeral recordings.

(a) * * *

(1) *2025 rate.* For the year 2025 for every physical phonorecord and Permanent Download the Licensee makes and distributes or authorizes to be made and distributed, the royalty rate

payable for each work embodied in the phonorecord or Permanent Download shall be either 12.7 cents or 2.45 cents per minute of playing time or fraction thereof, whichever amount is larger.
