would have prior notice regarding the suspension and delisting and/or a period to pay any unpaid fees prior to such suspension and delisting. For example, it is unclear if immediate suspension and delisting would occur even if the fees became due only one day prior to a quarterly or semi-annual review.

As a result, the Commission believes there are questions as to whether the proposal is consistent with Sections 6(b)(5) and 6(b)(7) of the Exchange Act.³⁸ For this reason, it is appropriate to institute proceedings pursuant to Section 19(b)(2)(B) of the Exchange Act ³⁹ to determine whether the proposal should be approved or disapproved.

IV. Procedure: Request for Written Comments

The Commission requests that interested persons provide written submissions of their data, views, and arguments with respect to the issues identified above, as well as any other concerns they may have with the proposal. In particular, the Commission invites the written views of interested persons concerning whether the proposed rule change is consistent with Sections 6(b)(5) and 6(b)(7) of the Exchange Act⁴⁰ or any other provision of the Exchange Act, or the rules and regulations thereunder. Although there do not appear to be any issues relevant to approval or disapproval that would be facilitated by an oral presentation of data, views, and arguments, the Commission will consider, pursuant to Rule 19b–4 under the Exchange Act,⁴¹ any request for an opportunity to make an oral presentation.42

Interested persons are invited to submit written data, views, and arguments regarding whether the proposed rule change should be approved or disapproved by February 7, 2025. Any person who wishes to file a rebuttal to any other person's submission must file that rebuttal by February 21, 2025. The Commission asks that commenters address the sufficiency of the Exchange's statements in support of the proposal, in addition to any other comments they may wish to submit about the proposed rule change.
