## Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 61st Congress, 3d session, is to be understood.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to sell at cost any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (\*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions, and unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents give the name of the issuing Department, Bureau, or Division, and title. If publication is numbered give number also. Do not order by Library of Congress card number.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to over a million, of which several hundred thousand are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that many of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

No general price-list of public documents is available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

### MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indices. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

## LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and  $\frac{7}{10}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. **Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress.** Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

## CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1910, the Index to the Monthly catalogue will be issued separately each quarter and will cumulate for the twelve months ending June, 1911. That is, the September number of the Index is an index to the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number is an index to the Monthly catalogue for October to December, the March number will be an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1911. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

## HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (\*) should be made to the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, by postal money order, express order, or New York draft. Currency may be sent at sender's risk.

*Postage stamps, foreign money, uncertified checks, defaced or smooth coins will positively not be accepted.*

**To facilitate the payment of the cost of documents, the Superintendent of Documents will hereafter accept coupons issued by him instead of cash. Coupons of the value of 5 cents each are sold in sets of 20 for \$1.00. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office.**

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

## NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

There is a new print, dated January 10, 1911, of Circular 21, 3d revision, Office of the Secretary of Agriculture, first issued August 12, 1910. This is a very important circular, its title being Rules and regulations for the enforcement of the food and drugs act. The full title of the food and drugs act is An act for preventing the manufacture, sale, or transportation of adulterated or misbranded or poisonous or deleterious foods, drugs, medicines, and liquors, and for regulating traffic therein, and for other purposes, approved June 30, 1906. Regulation 1 provides that this formidable title shall be put on the shelf and that the act "shall be known and referred to as The food and drugs act, June 30, 1906." The full text of the act is printed as a part of Circular 21.

It has become an established practice of the United States Geological Survey to issue each year a bulletin in which the conditions of the mining industry of Alaska and also the more important economic results of the year's investigations are summarized. The sixth issue in this series, covering the work of the calendar year 1909, has just been published as Bulletin 422, sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 40 cents. It is, like the earlier issues in the same series, intended to serve as a handbook of reference for those who are interested in the mining and mineral resources of Alaska. The earlier numbers are: Bulletin 259, 1904, 15 cents; Bulletin 284, 1905, 25 cents; Bulletin 314, 1906, 30 cents; Bulletin 345, 1907, 45 cents; Bulletin 379, 1908, 50 cents.

Bulletin 90, Labor Bureau, the number for September, 1910, carries seven unusually important papers, the first being a study of "Fatal accidents in coal mining" in which it is shown that the record of the United States in this respect is the worst in the world. The second paper discusses the subjects of employers' liability and workmen's compensation, summarizing the laws, the work of Federal and State commissions of investigation, the action taken by employers' and workmen's associations, etc. A third article presents in a summary form the important features of workmen's compensation systems in foreign countries. A fourth paper relates to the cost of employers' liability and workmen's compensation insurance at home and abroad.

Since an index has been added to Circular 3, Publications Division, Agriculture Department, it has become one of the indispensables for workers in public documents. A new edition, revised to October 15, 1910, is lately out of press. It is a list more than 100 pages long of the numerous publications of the Agriculture Department which are in the hands of the Superintendent of Documents for sale to the vast and ever-increasing public which eagerly awaits each new issue of these practical and helpful documents.



A title-page and index lately issued for National Museum Bulletin 39 marks the conclusion of the most long-drawnout bulletin to be found in all the list of United States Government publications. It has been issued in 20 parts, not numbered but lettered from A to S, there being two editions of Part N. Part A was issued in 1891, Part S in 1905. It is not the intention of the Museum to publish an edition of the completed bulletin, but it is now supplying title-page and contents for the convenience of those who have preserved the 20 parts and may wish to bind them. The title of Bulletin 39 as a whole is Directions for collecting and preserving specimens.

The report of the United States Forester for 1910 treats at length upon a subject of much import to the well being of the American people. It is on the whole an encouraging document.

The soy bean of the Agriculture Department is the soya bean of the Commerce and Labor Department, the soja of the Japanese, and the soy-bean (2 words in 1) of Bailey's Cyclopedia of agriculture. However spelled, it bids fair to become one of the important crops of the United States. We do not eat it ourselves as the Japanese and Chinese do, but we are beginning to feed it to our domestic animals, and are likely to do so more and more because, according to Bailey's Cyclopedia, it is "the richest natural vegetable food known." Plant Industry Bureau Bulletin 197 is a thick pamphlet given up entirely to the soy bean; history, varieties, and field studies. It is illustrated by photographic plates and is sold at 15 cents.

Contributions from the national herbarium, vol. 14, part 2, is History of the coconut palm in America, by O. F. Cook. The first thing one notices about it is that the familiar "a" in the word cocoanut has disappeared. So far as recollection serves, the Bureau of Science in the Philippines was the first authority to make this elision. It has now been adopted by the Manufactures Bureau and the National Museum and will probably become permanent. Mr. Cook expresses the belief that the coconut palm is a native of South America and was carried westward across the Pacific in prehistoric times instead of originating in the East Indies as many botanical authorities have supposed. This new theory is approved by Dr. Coville, who writes the letter of transmittal. This excellent pamphlet, with its numerous illustrations, is sold at 20 cents.

Mr. David E. Lantz, of the Department of Agriculture, is strongly possessed by the idea that there is profit to be gained in this country in raising the principal varieties of deer, elk, and antelope for market. His idea, which has heretofore been given publicity in documents of the Department, is now further elaborated in illustrated Bulletin 36 of the Biological Survey Bureau, entitled Raising deer and other large game animals in the United States. The author holds that deer can be raised at less cost than most animals, as they will pick up their own living on lands worthless for cultivation, and that they will do more toward clearing up brushy land than any other animal except the goat. This bulletin, well illustrated, sells for 15 cents.

Secretary Dickinson's special report on the Philippines has been issued as House document 1261 of the 61st Congress, 3d session. It is the latest

authoritative review of Philippine conditions, and in its 34 pages and 62 pages of appendix is full of information and interest. Included are long manifestos of the Nacionalista and Progresista parties, expressing the views of the native statesmen on the political situation and prospects.

Experiment Stations Office Bulletin 229 is intended to give a description and review of the best features of the delivery of water to irrigators as disclosed by practice in the irrigated sections of the United States. The title of the bulletin is Delivery of water to irrigators, and its price is 15 cents.

Another large volume of the classification of the Library of Congress has been "printed as manuscript." Its 551 pages cover the subject of social science. The book is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, in paper covers, at 65 cents.

Chemistry Bureau Bulletin 84, Influence of food preservatives and artificial colors on digestion and health, was printed in 5 parts, 1904-1908. Part 1, Boric acid and borax, first issued in 1904, has now been reprinted, with corrections. Price, in paper, 30 cents.

Special agents series 43, from the Manufactures Bureau, is on Trade development in Argentina. It presents many points of interest, among them the statement that Patagonia, which we have been accustomed to think of as an arid desert inhabited only by ostriches and giant savages, is now a great sheep range, pasturing some of the finest flocks in the world.

In view of recent discussion concerning the fortification or neutralization of the Panama Canal, Senate document 746, 61st Congress, 3d session, History of amendments proposed to the Clayton-Bulwer treaty, becomes of unusual interest. The "history," which is entirely documentary, was prepared in the State Department and sent by the late Secretary Hay to the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations several years ago, but it was not till January 8, 1911, that it was presented to the Senate by Senator Root and ordered printed. Copies may be bought for 5 cents. Listed in this catalogue under heading Senate.

House document 1262 of the current session of Congress contains the message of President Taft in relation to the inspection of reclamation projects by a board of Army officers and also the full text of the report of the Board, now first published. Those (if any) who expected that this report would be injurious to the Reclamation Service will be disappointed. It pays the Service several compliments and recommends the expenditure of the \$20,000,000 recently provided for by an issue of certificates in completing the projects which the Service has under way.

State banks and trust companies since the passage of the National bank act, with an appendix on the bank-guaranty acts of Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Nebraska, and South Dakota is a recent volume in the National Monetary Commission series. Technically, it is Senate document 659 of the 61st Congress. Price 30 cents.

The Civil Service Commission has issued its Manual of examinations for the spring of 1911. The Commission sends a copy free of charge to any applicant who is intending to try an examination.

The new list of its publications, issued by the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service January, 1911, includes information as to the

sale of these publications by the Superintendent of Documents and designates those which are now available.

Public health bulletin 41 contains the 12th and 13th of the Studies upon leprosy published by the Public Health and Marine-Hospital Service. The bulletins in this series should not be confused with the Hygienic Laboratory bulletins issued by the same Service.

The Annual report of the regents of the Smithsonian Institution for the fiscal year 1909 has been very recently issued. It carries a scientific miscellany of unusual weight and interest.

The 2d supplement to the Table of cases and opinions of the Interstate Commerce Commission covers the contents of volumes 18 and 19 of the Commission's Reports. Copies can be supplied by the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents.

Investigation of the Department of the Interior and of the Bureau of Forestry is a title which being interpreted signifies the great Ballinger-Pinchot controversy which for so long a time filled the newspapers. It is published as Senate document 719, 61st Congress, 3d session, in 13 vols., aggregating nearly 8,000 pages. Of the 13-vol. edition, 3,000 copies will be printed, and of vol. 1, containing the report of the 7 members composing the majority of the committee and the two minority reports, one signed by four members and the other by one member, 30,000 extra copies are to be printed.

#### HANDBOOK OF AMERICAN INDIANS

A little less than four years ago Part 1 of Bulletin 30, Bureau of American Ethnology, with title Handbook of American Indians north of Mexico, was issued and put on sale by the Superintendent of Documents at \$1.25 in cloth. Ever since there has been a steady stream of inquiries as to when Part 2 would be published. It has been a long wait between parts, but Part 2 is now published. It is about 250 pages larger than Part 1, and the price is \$1.50.

The handbook is in cyclopedic form, Part 1 containing the names and subjects alphabeted under the letters A-M and Part 2 the remainder of the alphabet. Part 1 contains 972 pages and a large folded map showing in colors the regions formerly occupied by the various families of Indians as determined by linguistic classification. Part 2 contains 1221 pages, including an extensive synonymy and an almost equally extensive bibliography. Both volumes contain lists of contributors, with the initials by which their contributions may be identified. Both volumes are also extensively illustrated.

No qualified person who examines this great work will be surprised because of delay in its publication. As a matter of fact, the work has been in contemplation, and at intervals in compilation, for nearly 40 years, and many of the most accomplished students of aboriginal lore have been at one time or another employed upon it. It is no doubt the most comprehensive and the most authoritative work on the American Indian yet published.



## QUESTIONS OF THE DAY

Senate report 961, 61st Congress, has the title Election of Senators by popular vote, and contains an 8-page bibliography of publications on the same subject. The list embraces about 200 titles, many of them being public documents on sale by the Superintendent of Documents.

Senate document 787, 61st Congress, entitled Canadian reciprocity, contains the President's message of January 26, 1911, the correspondence embodying the reciprocity agreement, and statistical data to show the effect that might be expected from the ratification of the agreement. Price, 10 cents; supply limited.

Senator Aldrich's Suggested plan for monetary legislation, submitted to the National Monetary Commission, has been printed in a pamphlet, sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 5 cents.

Brief statement of the conclusions and recommendations of the Immigration Commission, first published as an unnumbered pamphlet, has been republished as Senate document 783, 61st Congress. It gives a summary outline of the contents of the numerous volumes which the Commission is publishing. Price, 5 cents.

## EDUCATION REPORTS

The Commissioner of Education introduces his Annual report for 1909 with this interesting statement: "It is now possible, in accordance with an arrangement between the Secretary of the Interior and the Public Printer, to count with confidence on the issuance of the first volume of the Annual report of this office by the first week in December next following the close of the fiscal and scholastic year to which it relates." This hope of unusually early issue has now been approximately realized not only for 1909 but also for 1910. It is an important change, as for many years the Education report was regularly one of the most belated of all the many belated Government reports. The Commissioner congratulates himself, and no doubt with good reason, that the earlier issue of his first volume, which is largely a review of the educational advancement of the year, will lead to its wide use as a yearbook for reference as to educational movements of the recent past and educational progress of the immediate future.

In introducing the first volume of his Annual report for 1910 the Commissioner defines his conception of the mission of his Bureau and its relation to the educational organizations of the States. But a few words can be quoted here: "The primary responsibility for educational control rests with the several States. . . . While we have no national system of schools, we have a national programme of education. . . . The Annual reports of the Commissioner of Education are in effect a running account of the progress made by the nation in carrying out this educational programme." Citizens who are interested in educational methods and advancement will find their profit in reading the whole of this introduction. It is peculiarly pertinent in view of the recent discussions in Congress and in the press concerning the Commissioner's request for appropriations enabling him to engage specialists in various branches of

education to be employed "in the field," visiting institutions in all the States, gaining and imparting information.

The Superintendent of Documents can supply the 1909 Education report (in 2 vols., cloth binding) at 60 cents a volume, and vol. 1 of the 1910 Report at the same price. He has also a large stock of these reports for earlier years, back as far as 1870. Sets back to that date, with hardly a break, can be supplied. Quotations will be given on request.

#### NEW SERIES

The Interstate Commerce Commission has issued a First annual report of the statistics of express companies in the United States. It is for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1909. These reports will very desirably fill a gap in the available stock of statistical information.

The act to establish postal savings depositories has resulted in the creation not only of new series of documents but also of a new publishing office, from which in the fullness of time may proceed many publications. The Postal Savings System is the official style of the new publishing office, and its members are the Postmaster-General, the Secretary of the Treasury, and the Attorney-General, their collective official title in this capacity being Board of Trustees, Postal Savings System. Apparently the publications issued are presumed to proceed from the System rather than from the Board, as the words Postal Savings System appear at the top of each title-page. Thus far four such publications have reached the Public Documents Office. Their titles are: (1) Information for depositors; (2) Regulations promulgated by authority of the Board of Trustees, together with the Act of Congress approved June 25, 1910; (3) Instructions to postmasters; (4) Regulations for the guidance of banks qualifying as depositories of postal savings funds.

#### CONSULAR REPORTS

Under the new legislation, effective July 1, 1910, which discontinued the publication of the Monthly consular reports, the Daily consular reports were issued as a new series, the number for Tuesday, July 5, 1910, being inscribed New series, volume 1, no. 1, serial no. 1. This form, with of course the necessary changes of date and number, continued till Wednesday, August 31, 1910, New series, vol. 1, no. 50, serial no. 50. The number for Thursday, September 1, 1910, was inscribed 13th year, no. 51. This form continued till Saturday, December 31, 1910, no. 152. The issue for Tuesday, January 3, 1911, is inscribed 14th year, no. 1. It is evident therefore that the present plan is to begin a new set of numbers with each calendar year, instead of using a continuous number as in the old series, which terminated February 28, 1910, with serial number 3722, and was followed by a weekly series of which 18 numbers were issued, the last being that for June 30, 1910.

Librarians will of course note these various changes, and will observe that in citing the Daily consular reports the use of the year as well as the number will hereafter be necessary.

## SPECIAL CONSULAR REPORTS

The series of publications known as Special consular reports, begun in the State Department in 1890, transferred to the Statistics Bureau, Commerce and Labor Department, in 1903, and to the Manufactures Bureau, same Department, in 1905, has latterly fallen into some confusion in numbering. Special consular reports have differed from the Monthly and Daily consular reports by the fact that each Special report has been made upon a specific subject while the monthlies and dailies have related to a variety of subjects. The State Department began publishing the Special reports as numbered volumes, though few of them have exceeded an average pamphlet in size. The volume numbering has been continued by the Statistics and Manufactures bureaus, though the latter has also issued a number of publications of similar character as mere fugitive pamphlets, unattached to any series and unnumbered. Volume number 40 was reached in 1907. Its subject was Motor machines and it was issued in two parts, the 2d part not appearing till 1908. This volume was also published as House document 846, 60th Congress, 1st session. In 1909, by an act of forgetfulness, a bunch of reports on the soya bean was published as Special consular reports, volume 40, thus again duplicating a number which had been used thrice before. The Public Documents Office of course promptly called attention to the duplication. Thereupon the Manufactures Bureau withdrew the duplicated number 40 and the soya bean reports were left in the air unattached. In 1910 the Manufactures Bureau issued Special consular reports, vols. 42 and 43, each in three parts. Thus the set was broken, there being no vol. 41. This gap the Manufactures Bureau has now filled by gathering up the unnumbered pamphlets which may properly be classed as Special consular reports and arranging them as parts of vol. 41. There are six of these, and the titles under which they were published and the part numbers now assigned them are given herewith:

These six pamphlets have not either volume number or part number on their covers or title-pages, but librarians who wish to complete their sets by supplying vol. 41 have the sanction of the publishing office (the Manufactures Bureau) for adding to their copies the numbers as here given. This has been done with the copies in the Public Documents Library, and it would seem to be the proper thing to be done by any library that cares to have a straight set of the publications of the Manufactures Bureau—the bureau through which all commercial reports from United States consuls are now published.

A uniform scale of 1 inch to 1 mile is used. Editions are not issued, but sun-print copies are produced in response to special calls addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post-Office Department. These maps should not be confused with the post route maps described in the preceding paragraph.
