SIR: In accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the act of Congress approved April 24, 1917 (first Liberty bond act), and section 10 of the act of Congress approved September 24, 1917 (second Liberty bond act), as amended, I have the honor to submit herewith statements of approved expenditures under said acts through the fiscal year ended June 30, 1925.

## I. EXPENDITURES FOR EXPENSES OF LOANS

Three appropriation accounts have been established on the books of the Treasury Department as follows: 1. Expenses of loans, act of April 24, 1917, (for expenses incurred

prior to September 24, 1917).

2. Expenses of loans, act of September 24, 1917, as amended, (for expenses incurred between September 24, 1917, and June 30, 1921). 3. Expenses of loans, act of September 24, 1917, as amended and

extended, (for expenses incurred from July 1, 1921).

## II. EXPENDITURES FROM REPAYMENTS OF FOREIGN LOANS

On June 30, 1924, there was an unexpended balance on account of repayments by foreign governments of principal of loans made under the Liberty bond acts amounting to \$76,688.87. During the year ended June 30, 1925, cash repayments on the same account amounting to \$309,512.71 were received, making a total of \$386,201.58. Of said amount \$386,100 were expended during the year on account

of redemption at par of maturing obligations of the United States, leaving an unexpended balance of \$101.58 on June 30, 1925. The following is a detailed statement of such redemptions:

There were also received during the year on account of principal payments due under the British debt agreement obligations of the United States in par amount \$22,823,000. These obligations have been canceled and retired and the public debt reduced accordingly.
