3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Facilities5 Emergency Power Supply Act of 2001".

6 SEC. 2. STUDY OF FEDERAL BACKUP GENERATION.

7 The Administrator of the General Services Adminis-8 tration shall undertake a study to identify all potential

electrical capacity at Federal facilities throughout the
country available from existing installed backup genera tors. The Administrator shall submit a report within 90
days after the enactment of this Act to the Secretary of
Energy and the Congress containing the findings of the
study under this section.
