Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. MINIMUM WAGE AND MAXIMUM HOURS EXEMP
TION FOR CERTAIN SEASONAL FIREWORKS

EMPLOYEES.

Section 13(a) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of

1938 (29 U.S.C. 213(a)) is amended by inserting after

paragraph (8) the following new paragraph:

1 "(9) any employee employed, on a seasonal 2 basis, at a facility or location the primary source of 3 revenue of which is derived from the sale of fire-4 works directly to consumers; or".
