Mr. CONRAD introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To establish a Community Oriented Policing Services anti-methamphetamine grant program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be referred to as the “COPS Anti-
5 Methamphetamine Act of 2002”.

6 **SEC. 2. GRANTS AUTHORIZED.**

7 The Attorney General shall make grants on a com-
8 petitive basis to State and local community policing pro-
9 grams aimed at anti-methamphetamine enforcement, pro-

1 duction, prevention, treatment, training, and intelligence
2 gathering efforts.

3 **SEC. 3. USE OF FUNDS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Grants made under section 2 may
5 be used to support personnel salary, equipment, and tech-
6 nology upgrades, officer overtime, and training.

7 (b) ASSISTANCE FROM COPS OFFICE.—The Com-
8 munity Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Office in the
9 Department of Justice shall work directly with partici-
10 pating State and local community policing programs to as-
11 sist in crafting innovative anti-methamphetamine strate-
12 gies.

13 **SEC. 4. APPLICATION.**

14 Each eligible entity that desires a grant under this
15 Act shall submit an application to the Attorney General
16 at such time, in such manner, and accompanied by such
17 information as the Attorney General may reasonably re-
18 quire.

19 **SEC. 5. SUPPLEMENT AND NOT SUPPLANT.**

20 Grant amounts received under this Act shall be used
21 to supplement, and not supplant, other funds received by
22 State and local community policing programs to assist in
23 the methamphetamine problem.

1 **SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be appro-
3 priated \$75,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2003 through
4 2007.

5 (b) LIMITATION.—Not less than 50 percent of the
6 amount appropriated in each fiscal year under subsection
7 (a) shall be awarded to local community policing programs
8 that serve a population of not more than 150,000.

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
