# A BILL

## To reduce gun trafficking by prohibiting bulk purchases of handguns.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Gun Trafficking

5 Act of 2001".

#### 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION AGAINST MULTIPLE HANDGUN SALES

### 7 **OR PURCHASES.**

8 (a) PROHIBITION.—Section 922 of title 18, United

9 States Code, is amended by inserting after subsection (y)

10 the following:

1	"(z) Prohibition Against Multiple Handgun
2	Sales or Purchases.—
3	"(1) IN GENERAL.—It shall be unlawful for any
4	licensed dealer—
5	"(A) during any 30-day period, to sell 2 or
6	more handguns to an individual who is not li-
7	censed under section 923; or
8	"(B) to sell a handgun to an individual
9	who is not licensed under section 923 and who
10	purchased a handgun during the 30-day period
11	ending on the date of the sale.
12	"(2) TIME LIMITATION.—It shall be unlawful
13	for any individual who is not licensed under section
14	923 to purchase 2 or more handguns during any 30-
15	day period.
16	"(3) EXCHANGES.—Paragraph (1) does not
17	apply to an exchange of 1 handgun for 1 handgun.".
18	(b) Penalties.—Section 924(a)(2) of title 18,
19	United States Code, is amended by striking "or (o)" and
20	inserting "(o), or (z)".
21	SEC. 3. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR MAKING KNOWINGLY
22	FALSE STATEMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH
23	FIREARMS.
24	Section 924(a)(3) of title 18, United States Code, is
25	amended by striking "one year" and inserting "5 years".

3 (a) HANDGUN TRANSFERS SUBJECT TO THE WAIT4 ING PERIOD.—Section 922(s)(6)(B)(i) of title 18, United
5 States Code, is amended by striking "20 business days"
6 and inserting "35 calendar days".

7 (b) FIREARMS TRANSFERS SUBJECT TO INSTANT
8 CHECK.—Section 922(t)(2)(C) of title 18, United States
9 Code, is amended by inserting "not later than 35 calendar
10 days after the date the system provides the licensee with
11 the number," before "destroy".

#### 12 SEC. 5. REVISED DEFINITION.

Section 921(a)(21)(C) of title 18, United States
Code, is amended by inserting ", except that such term
shall include any person who transfers more than 1 handgun in any 30-day period to a person who is not a licensed
dealer" before the semicolon.
