5	The time limitations specified in sections 6248(a) and
6	6250 of title 10, United States Code, shall not apply with
7	respect to the posthumous award of the Medal of Honor
8	under section 6241 of such title to Doris Miller (service
9	number 356–12–35) for acts of heroism during World
10	War II while a member of the United States Navy.
