- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Justice
- 5 Appropriations Authorization Act, Fiscal Year 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. SUMS AUTHORIZED TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR FIS-
- 7 CAL YEAR 2011.
- 8 There are authorized to be appropriated for fiscal
- 9 year 2011, to carry out the activities of the Department
- 10 of Justice (including any bureau, office, board, division,
