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## A BILL

To authorize appropriations for the Department of Justice  
for fiscal year 2011.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Department of Justice  
5       Appropriations Authorization Act, Fiscal Year 2011”.

6       **SEC. 2. SUMS AUTHORIZED TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR FIS-**  
7       **CAL YEAR 2011.**

8       There are authorized to be appropriated for fiscal  
9       year 2011, to carry out the activities of the Department  
10      of Justice (including any bureau, office, board, division,

1 commission, subdivision, unit, or other component thereof)  
2 not otherwise authorized, the following:

3 (1) GENERAL ADMINISTRATION.—For General  
4 Administration: \$223,336,000.

5 (2) ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW AND APPEALS.—  
6 For administration of pardon and clemency petitions  
7 and for immigration-related activities: \$319,220,000.

8 (3) OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL.—For the  
9 Office of Inspector General: \$88,792,000.

10 (4) GENERAL LEGAL ACTIVITIES.—For General  
11 Legal Activities: \$976,389,000.

12 (5) ANTITRUST DIVISION.—For the Antitrust  
13 Division: \$167,028,000.

14 (6) UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS.—For United  
15 States Attorneys: \$2,041,269,000.

16 (7) FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.—  
17 For the Federal Bureau of Investigation:  
18 \$8,165,791,000.

19 (8) UNITED STATES MARSHALS SERVICE.—For  
20 the United States Marshals Service: \$1,207,159,000.

21 (9) FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM.—For the Fed-  
22 eral Prison System, including the National Institute  
23 of Corrections: \$6,803,512,000.

1           (10) DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION.—  
2       For the Drug Enforcement Administration:  
3       \$2,130,117,000.

4           (11) BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, FIRE-  
5       ARMS, AND EXPLOSIVES.—For the Bureau of Alco-  
6       hol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives:  
7       \$1,162,986,000.

8           (12) FEES AND EXPENSES OF WITNESSES.—  
9       For Fees and Expenses of Witnesses: \$270,000,000.

10          (13) INTERAGENCY CRIME AND DRUG EN-  
11       FORCEMENT.—For Interagency Crime and Drug  
12       Enforcement: \$579,319,000, for expenses not other-  
13       wise provided for, for the investigation and prosecu-  
14       tion of persons involved in organized crime drug  
15       trafficking, except that any funds obligated from ap-  
16       propriations authorized by this paragraph may be  
17       used under authorities available to the organizations  
18       reimbursed from such funds.

19          (14) FOREIGN CLAIMS SETTLEMENT COMMIS-  
20       SION.—For the Foreign Claims Settlement Commis-  
21       sion: \$2,159,000.

22          (15) COMMUNITY RELATIONS SERVICE.—For  
23       the Community Relations Service: \$12,606,000.

1           (16) ASSETS FORFEITURE FUND.—For ex-  
2           penses authorized by section 524(c) of title 28,  
3           United States Code: \$20,990,000.

4           (17) UNITED STATES PAROLE COMMISSION.—  
5           For the United States Parole Commission:  
6           \$13,582,000.

7           (18) FEDERAL DETENTION TRUSTEE.—For ex-  
8           penses of the Federal Detention Trustee:  
9           \$1,533,863,000.

10          (19) OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS.—For ad-  
11          ministrative expenses of the Office of Justice Pro-  
12          grams: \$216,396,000 (including the expenses of the  
13          Office of Audit, Assessment, and Management).

14          (20) OFFICE ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN.—  
15          For administrative expenses of the Office on Vio-  
16          lence Against Women: \$22,735,000.

17          (21) COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERV-  
18          ICES OFFICE.—For administrative expenses of the  
19          Community Oriented Policing Services Office:  
20          \$40,312,000.

21          (22) NATIONAL DRUG INTELLIGENCE CEN-  
22          TER.—For the National Drug Intelligence Center:  
23          \$44,580,000.

1           (23) JUSTICE INFORMATION SHARING TECH-  
2           NOLOGY.—For Justice Information Sharing Tech-  
3           nology: \$179,785,000.

4           (24) LAW ENFORCEMENT WIRELESS COMMU-  
5           NICATIONS.—For Law Enforcement Wireless Com-  
6           munications: \$207,727,000.

7           (25) NATIONAL SECURITY DIVISION.—For the  
8           National Security Division: \$99,537,000.

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
