3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE CLEAN AIR ACT.**

4 (a) HYDROGEN SULFIDE AS A HAZARDOUS AIR POL-
5 LUTANT.—Section 112 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.
6 7412) is amended by adding “Hydrogen Sulfide” to the
7 list of hazardous air pollutants under subsection (b)(1) of
8 such section.

1 (b) REPEAL OF EXEMPTION FOR AGGREGATION OF
2 EMISSIONS FROM OIL AND GAS DEVELOPMENT
3 SOURCES.—Section 112(n) of the Clean Air Act (42
4 U.S.C. 7412(n)) is amended by striking paragraph (4).
