Mr. JOHNSON of Ohio introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to conduct cost-benefit analyses of certain contracts.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Accountability in Con-
5 tract Execution Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. COST-BENEFIT ANALYSES OF CERTAIN CONTRACTS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter I of chapter 5 of title
8 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
9 the following:

1 **“§ 517. Cost-benefit analyses of certain contracts**

2 “(a) IN GENERAL.—(1) The Secretary shall—

3 “(A) conduct a cost-benefit analysis of each
4 contract described in paragraph (2); and

5 “(B) notify the Committees on Veterans’ Af-
6 fairs of the House of Representatives and the Senate
7 of each such contract and the office of the Depart-
8 ment where the cost-benefit analysis for such con-
9 tract is located.

10 “(2) A contract described in this paragraph is a con-
11 tract awarded by the Secretary that is valued at more than
12 \$100,000,000, including—

13 “(A) a sole-source contract;

14 “(B) an undefinitized contract;

15 “(C) a split contract; or

16 “(D) an indefinite delivery-indefinite quantity
17 contract.

18 “(b) ELEMENTS.—Each cost-benefit analysis con-
19 ducted under subsection (a)(1)(A) shall include—

20 “(1) a cost analysis detailing—

21 “(A) the economic feasibility of the con-
22 tract, including the costs and benefits;

23 “(B) the technical feasibility of the award-
24 ed contract, including its effectiveness and ade-
25 quacy at achieving the stated goal of the con-
26 tract;

1 “(C) the cost effectiveness of the contract,
2 including why selecting the particular con-
3 tractor provides the best value for the dollar
4 amount of the contract; and

5 “(D) the manner in which the Secretary
6 adhered to best industry practices in writing,
7 bidding, and awarding the contract, including a
8 description of—

9 “(i) any industry expertise used; and

10 “(ii) the primary stakeholders related
11 to the contract and the manner in which
12 the Secretary identified such stakeholders;
13 and

14 “(2) written certification that, during the con-
15 tracting process, the Secretary considered all alter-
16 natives in a fair, competitive, and ethical contracting
17 environment.

18 “(c) SUBMISSION TO CONGRESS.—Upon request by
19 the Committee on Veterans’ Affairs of the House of Rep-
20 resentatives or the Committee on Veterans’ Affairs of the
21 Senate, the Secretary shall submit to such committee a
22 cost-benefit analysis conducted under subsection (a)(1)(A)
23 by not later than the date that is 10 days after the date
24 of the request.”.

1 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
2 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
3 after the item relating to section 516 the following new
4 item:

“517. Cost-benefit analyses of certain contracts.”.

5 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Section 517 of title 38,
6 United States Code, as added by subsection (a), shall
7 apply with respect to contracts entered into by the Sec-
8 retary of Veterans Affairs on or after the date of the en-
9 actment of this Act.

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
