A BILL

2 ity of the Department of the Treasury provided in
3 section 3123 of title 31, United States Code, to pay
4 with legal tender the principal and interest on debt
5 held by the public.

6 **SEC. 3. EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO PRO-**
7 **VIDE PAY AND ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS**
8 **OF THE ARMED FORCES DURING FUNDING**
9 **GAP IMPACTING THE DEPARTMENT OF DE-**
10 **FENSE OR DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SE-**
11 **CURITY.**

12 (a) APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR MILITARY PAY
13 AND ALLOWANCES.—During a funding gap impacting the
14 Armed Forces, the Secretary of the Treasury shall make
15 available to the Secretary of Defense (and the Secretary
16 of Homeland Security in the case of the Coast Guard),
17 out of any amounts in the general fund of the Treasury
18 not otherwise appropriated, such amounts as the Secretary
19 of Defense (and the Secretary of Homeland Security in
20 the case of the Coast Guard) determines to be necessary
21 to continue to provide pay and allowances (without inter-
22 ruption) to members of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Ma-
23 rine Corps, and Coast Guard, including reserve compo-
24 nents thereof, who perform active service during the fund-
25 ing gap.

1 (b) FUNDING GAP DEFINED.—In this section, the
2 term “funding gap” means any period of time after the
3 beginning of a fiscal year for which interim or full-year
4 appropriations for the personnel accounts of the Armed
5 Forces for that fiscal year have not been enacted.

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
