Mr. HALL (for himself, Mr. SAM JOHNSON of Texas, Mr. COBLE, Mr. CONYERS, and Mr. DINGELL) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To authorize a Wall of Remembrance as part of the Korean War Veterans Memorial and to allow certain private contributions to fund that Wall of Remembrance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. WALL OF REMEMBRANCE.**

4 Section 1 of the Act titled “An Act to authorize the
5 erection of a memorial on Federal Land in the District
6 of Columbia and its environs to honor members of the
7 Armed Forces of the United States who served in the Ko-
8 rean War”, approved October 25, 1986 (Public Law 99–
9 572), is amended by adding at the end the following:

1 “Such memorial shall include a Wall of Remembrance.
2 The American Battle Monuments Commission shall re-
3 quest and consider design recommendations from the Ko-
4 rean War Veterans Memorial Foundation, Inc. for the es-
5 tablishment of the Wall of Remembrance. The Wall of Re-
6 membrance shall include—

7 “(1) a list by name of members of the Armed
8 Forces of the United States who were killed in ac-
9 tion in the Korean War;

10 “(2) the number of members of the Armed
11 Forces of the United States who, in regards to the
12 Korean War—

13 “(A) were wounded in action;

14 “(B) are listed as missing in action; or

15 “(C) were prisoners of war; and

16 “(3) the number of members of the Korean
17 Augmentation to the United States Army, the Re-
18 public of Korea Armed Forces, and the other na-
19 tions of the United Nations Command who, in re-
20 gards to the Korean War—

21 “(A) were killed in action;

22 “(B) were wounded in action;

23 “(C) are listed as missing in action; or

24 “(D) were prisoners of war.”.
