Mr. CASEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To require regular audits of, and improvements to, the Transition Assistance Program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Veteran Transition As-
5 sistance Program Audit Act of 2011”.

6 **SEC. 2. AUDITS OF THE TRANSITION ASSISTANCE PRO-**
7 **GRAM.**

8 (a) CONTRACT.—The Secretary of Labor shall enter
9 into a contract for audits of the Transition Assistance
10 Program carried out under chapter 58 of title 10, United

1 States Code. The Secretary of Labor shall enter into such
2 contract with a private organization not affiliated with the
3 program, and shall ensure that the audits are conducted
4 not less often than once every 3 years.

5 (b) AUDIT.—In conducting such an audit, the organi-
6 zation shall measure the effectiveness of the Transition
7 Assistance Program, and identify any measures needed to
8 improve the effectiveness of the program.

9 (c) REPORT.—At the conclusion of each audit, the
10 organization shall prepare a report containing the findings
11 resulting from the audit, and recommendations for im-
12 proving the effectiveness of the program. The organization
13 shall submit the report to the Secretary of Labor, the
14 other Secretaries referred to in section 1144 of title 10,
15 United States Code, the Committee on Armed Services
16 and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of
17 Representatives, and the Committee on Armed Services
18 and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate.

19 (d) IMPROVEMENTS.—The Secretary of Labor, in
20 conjunction with the other Secretaries, shall review the re-
21 port and shall implement any measures needed to improve
22 the effectiveness of the Transition Assistance Program.
