Mr. ENZI (for himself and Mr. CASEY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship

A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to permit agencies to count certain contracts toward contracting goals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Fair-
5 ness Act of 2011”.

6 **SEC. 2. TEAMING ARRANGEMENTS AND AGENCY CON-**
7 **TRACTING GOALS.**

8 Section 15(g) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
9 644(g)) is amended by adding at the end the following:

1 “(3) TEAMING ARRANGEMENTS AND AGENCY
2 CONTRACTING GOALS.—

3 “(A) DEFINITIONS.—In this paragraph—

4 “(i) the term ‘covered small business
5 concern’ means—

6 “(I) a small business concern
7 owned and controlled by service-dis-
8 abled veterans;

9 “(II) a small business concern
10 owned and controlled by socially and
11 economically disadvantaged individ-
12 uals, as defined in section 8(d)(3)(C);

13 “(III) a small business concern
14 owned and controlled by women, as
15 defined in section 8(d)(3)(D); or

16 “(IV) a qualified HUBZone small
17 business concern; and

18 “(ii) the term ‘teaming arrangement
19 entity’ means a prime contractor under a
20 contractor team arrangement, as defined in
21 section 9.601 of the Federal Acquisition
22 Regulation, as in effect on October 1,
23 2009.

24 “(B) CONTRACTING GOALS.—If a covered
25 small business concern performs the obligations

1 of a teaming arrangement entity under a con-
2 tract between the teaming arrangement entity
3 and a Federal agency, the head of the Federal
4 agency may deem the contract to be a contract
5 awarded to the covered small business concern
6 for purposes of determining whether the Fed-
7 eral agency has met the goals established by the
8 head of the Federal agency under paragraph
9 (2).”.
