A BILL

To require that members of the Armed Forces who were killed or wounded in the attack that occurred at a recruiting station in Little Rock, Arkansas, on June 1, 2009, are treated in the same manner as members who are killed or wounded in a combat zone.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Honoring Ezeagwula
5 and Long Act” or the “HEAL Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. EQUITABLE TREATMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE**
2 **ARMED FORCES KILLED OR WOUNDED IN**
3 **LITTLE ROCK RECRUITING STATION ATTACK.**

4 For purposes of all applicable Federal laws, regula-
5 tions, and policies, the members of the Armed Forces who
6 were killed or wounded in the attack that occurred at a
7 recruiting station in Little Rock, Arkansas, on June 1,
8 2009, shall be deemed to have been killed or wounded in
9 a combat zone as the result of an act of an enemy of the
10 United States.
