A BILL

For the relief of Al-Housseynou Ba.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
5 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
6 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Al-Housseynou Ba shall be eligible
7 for an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status to that
8 of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence
9 upon filing an application for issuance of an immigrant
10 visa under section 204 of that Act (8 U.S.C. 1154) or
11 for adjustment of status to lawful permanent resident.

1 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Al-Housseynou Ba
2 enters the United States before the filing deadline set
3 forth in subsection (c), Al-Housseynou Ba shall be consid-
4 ered to have entered and remained lawfully in the United
5 States and shall be eligible for adjustment to lawful per-
6 manent resident status under section 245 of the Immigra-
7 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date
8 of the enactment of this Act.

9 (c) APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Sub-
10 sections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the application for
11 issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status
12 are filed with appropriate fees not later than 2 years after
13 the date of the enactment of this Act.

14 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBERS.—
15 Upon granting immigrant visas or lawful permanent resi-
16 dent status to Al-Housseynou Ba, the Secretary of State
17 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one, during
18 the current or next following fiscal year, the total number
19 of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of
20 the country of birth of Al-Housseynou Ba under section
21 202(a)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
22 U.S.C. 1152(a)(2)).
