## A BILL

3 **SECTION 1. MATCHING FUNDS FOR APPALACHIAN DEVEL-**  
4 **OPMENT HIGHWAY PROJECTS.**

5 Section 120(j)(1)(A) of title 23, United States Code,  
6 is amended by striking “and the Appalachian development  
7 highway system program under section 14501 of title 40”.
