A BILL

3 **SECTION 1. DEVELOPMENT OF GUIDELINES FOR USE OF**
4 **UNOFFICIAL SOURCES OF INFORMATION TO**
5 **DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY OF MEMBERS AND**
6 **FORMER MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES**
7 **FOR BENEFITS AND DECORATIONS WHEN**
8 **THE SERVICE RECORDS ARE INCOMPLETE**
9 **BECAUSE OF DAMAGE TO THE OFFICIAL**
10 **RECORD.**

11 (a) GUIDELINES REQUIRED.—The Secretary of De-
12 fense shall develop guidelines regarding the use by the
13 Secretaries of the military departments and the Secretary
14 of Veterans Affairs of unofficial sources of information,
15 including eyewitness statements, to determine the eligi-
16 bility of a member or former member of the Armed Forces
17 for benefits and decorations when the service records of
18 the member are incomplete because of damage to the
19 records as a result of the 1973 fire at the National Per-
20 sonnel Records Center in St. Louis, Missouri, or any sub-
21 sequent incident while the records were in the possession
22 of the Department of Defense.

23 (b) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary of Defense shall
24 prepare the guidelines in consultation with the Secretary
25 of Veterans Affairs, with respect to veterans benefits

1 under title 38, United States Code, whose eligibility deter-
2 minations depend on the use of service records maintained
3 by the Department of Defense.

4 (c) TIME FOR COMPLETION.—The Secretary of De-
5 fense shall complete development of the guidelines not
6 later than one year after the date of the enactment of this
7 Act.

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
