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## A BILL

To transfer certain items from the United States Munitions  
List to the Commerce Control List.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Export Control Reform  
3 Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. EXPORT CONTROL REFORM ACT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 38(f) of  
6 the Arms Export Control Act (22 U.S.C. 2778(f)) or any  
7 other provision of law, all items described in subsection  
8 (b) that are on the United States Munitions List and con-  
9 trolled under section 38 of the Arms Export Control Act  
10 (22 U.S.C. 2778) on the date of the enactment of this  
11 Act shall be transferred to the Commerce Control List of  
12 dual-use items in the Export Administration Regulations  
13 (15 C.F.R. part 730 et seq.).

14 (b) TRANSFERRED ITEMS.—The items referred to in  
15 subsection (a) are the following:

16 (1) Non-automatic and semi-automatic fire-  
17 arms, including all rifles, carbines, pistols, revolvers  
18 and shotguns.

19 (2) Non-automatic and non-semi-automatic ri-  
20 fles, carbines, revolvers, or pistols of a caliber great-  
21 er than .50 inches (12.7 mm) up to and including  
22 .72 inches (18.0 mm).

23 (3) Ammunition for such firearms excluding  
24 caseless ammunition.

25 (4) Silencers, mufflers, and sound and flash  
26 suppressors.

1 (5) Rifle scopes.

2 (6) Barrels, cylinders, receivers (frames), or  
3 complete breech mechanisms.

4 (7) Related components, parts, accessories, at-  
5 tachments, tooling, and equipment for any articles  
6 listed in paragraphs (1) through (6).

7 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect  
8 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act and  
9 shall not apply to any export license issued before such  
10 effective date or to any export license application made  
11 under the United States Munitions List before such effec-  
12 tive date.

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
