RESOLUTION

Condemning the horrific acts of violence and hatred in Dal-

las, Texas, on July 7, 2016, and expressing support and prayers for all those impacted by the tragedy.

Whereas, on July 7, 2016, during a rally and march in Dallas, Texas, a lone gunman opened fire, killing 5 police officers and wounding 9 other officers and 2 bystanders;

Whereas this act of violence and hatred is the deadliest attack on United States law enforcement officers since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001;

Whereas this act of violence and hatred occurred during a lawful, peaceful, nonviolent political demonstration;

Whereas this attack took place with the intention of targeting police officers;

Whereas Federal, State, and local law enforcement personnel performed their duties admirably during the attack and risked their lives for the safety of the people of Dallas; and

Whereas the residents of Dallas came together to support the victims, and the families, friends, and loved ones of the victims: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate—

2 (1) condemns, in the strongest possible terms,
3 the heinous attack that occurred in Dallas, Texas,
4 on July 7, 2016;

5 (2) expresses its belief that an attack upon a
6 police officer is an affront to the rule of law and the
7 promise of justice, domestic tranquility, common de-
8 fense, and general welfare and the blessings of lib-

1 erty secured by the Constitution of the United
2 States;

3 (3) offers its condolences to the families,
4 friends, and loved ones of those who were killed
5 while protecting the city of Dallas and expresses its
6 hope for the quick and complete recovery of the sur-
7 vivors wounded in the shooting;

8 (4) applauds the bravery and dedication exhib-
9 ited by the hundreds of Federal, State, and local law
10 enforcement officials, emergency medical responders,
11 and others who offered their support and assistance;
12 and

13 (5) stands together united against violence and
14 hatred, and in support of the brave and honorable
15 police officers across the United States who work
16 every day to keep the country safe.
