AN ACT

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to provide for financial assistance to fund certain cybersecurity and infrastructure security education and training programs and initiatives, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Cybersecurity Grants
3 for Schools Act of 2022”.

4 **SEC. 2. STRENGTHENING CYBERSECURITY EDUCATION**
5 **SUPPORT.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2220 of the Homeland
7 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 665f) is amended by add-
8 ing at the end the following new subsection:

9 “(e) GRANTS AND COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—
10 The Director may award financial assistance in the form
11 of grants or cooperative agreements to States, local gov-
12 ernments, institutions of higher education (as such term
13 is defined in section 101 of the Higher Education Act of
14 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001)), nonprofit organizations, and
15 other non-Federal entities as determined appropriate by
16 the Director for the purpose of funding cybersecurity and
17 infrastructure security education and training programs
18 and initiatives to—

19 “(1) carry out the purposes of CETAP; and

20 “(2) enhance CETAP to address the national
21 shortfall of cybersecurity professionals.”.

22 (b) BRIEFINGS.—Paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of
23 section 2220 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
24 U.S.C. 665f) is amended—

25 (1) by redesignating subparagraphs (C) and
26 (D) as subparagraphs (D) and (E) respectively; and
