RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President to provide certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to online censorship of political speech.

1 *Resolved*, That the President of the United States is
2 requested to furnish the House of Representatives, not
3 later than 14 days after the date of adoption of this reso-
4 lution, copies of any document, record, audio recording,
5 memorandum, call log, correspondence (electronic or oth-

1 erwise), or other communication in his possession, or any
2 portion of any document, record, audio recording, memo-
3 randum, call log, correspondence (electronic or otherwise),
4 or other communication, that refers or relates to the fol-
5 lowing:

6 (1) Communication or coordination between the
7 Executive Office of the President and social media
8 companies regarding censorship, moderation, or re-
9 moval of content on social media platforms.

10 (2) The statement made by White House Press
11 Secretary Jen Psaki on July 15, 2021, that the Ex-
12 ecutive Office of the President had been “flagging
13 problematic posts for Facebook that spread misin-
14 formation”.

15 (3) The statement made by Surgeon General
16 Vivek Murphy regarding the Administration asking
17 social media companies to “take action against mis-
18 information super spreaders on their platforms”.

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
