To modify the boundary of the Casa Grande Ruins National
Monument, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Casa Grande Ruins
5 National Monument Boundary Modification Act of 2021”.

1 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

2 Congress finds that—

3 (1) Casa Grande Ruin Reservation was—

4 (A) set aside on March 2, 1889;

5 (B) proclaimed as the first archaeological
6 preserve in the United States on June 22,
7 1892; and

8 (C) redesignated as the “Casa Grande
9 Ruins National Monument” on August 3, 1918;

10 (2) the Casa Grande Ruins National Monument
11 protects 1 of the finest architectural examples of
12 14th century Hohokam culture in the Southwest,
13 which was known to early Spanish explorers as the
14 “Great House”;

15 (3) Casa Grande is only part of the story of an
16 ancient town that may have covered 2 square miles;
17 and

18 (4) recent surveys and research have deter-
19 mined that the area of the Great House and the vil-
20 lage surrounding the Great House extends beyond
21 the existing boundary of the Casa Grande Ruins Na-
22 tional Monument.

23 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

24 In this Act:

25 (1) BIA LAND.—The term “BIA land” means
26 the approximately 7.41 acres of Federal land admin-

1 istered by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as generally
2 depicted on the map as “BIA land to NPS”.

3 (2) BLM LAND PARCEL A.—The term “BLM
4 land parcel A” means the approximately 3.8 acres of
5 Federal land administered by the Bureau of Land
6 Management, as generally depicted on the map as
7 “BLM land parcel A to NPS”.

8 (3) BLM LAND PARCEL B.—The term “BLM
9 land parcel B” means the approximately 3.7 acres of
10 Federal land administered by the Bureau of Land
11 Management, as generally depicted on the map as
12 “BLM land parcel B to BIA”.

13 (4) MAP.—The term “map” means the map en-
14 titled “Casa Grande Ruins National Monument Pro-
15 posed Boundary Adjustment”, numbered 303/
16 120,734B, and dated February 2021.

17 (5) MONUMENT.—The term “Monument”
18 means the Casa Grande Ruins National Monument
19 in the State.

20 (6) NPS LAND.—The term “NPS land” means
21 the approximately 3.5 acres of Federal land adminis-
22 tered by the National Park Service, as generally de-
23 picted on the map as “NPS land to BIA”.

24 (7) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
25 the Secretary of the Interior.

1 (8) STATE.—The term “State” means the State
2 of Arizona.

3 **SEC. 4. ACQUISITION AND TRANSFER OF ADMINISTRATIVE**
4 **JURISDICTION OVER CERTAIN LAND.**

5 (a) ACQUISITION OF LAND.—The Secretary may ac-
6 quire by donation, exchange, or purchase with donated or
7 appropriated funds, from willing sellers only, land or an
8 interest in land generally depicted on the map as “State
9 land of Arizona” or “Private land”, to be administered
10 as part of the Monument.

11 (b) TRANSFER OF ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDIC-
12 TION.—

13 (1) WITHDRAWAL.—The BIA land, BLM land
14 parcel A, and BLM land parcel B are withdrawn
15 from—

16 (A) all forms of entry, appropriation, and
17 disposal under the public land laws;

18 (B) location, entry, and patent under the
19 mining laws; and

20 (C) operation of the mineral leasing and
21 geothermal leasing laws and mineral materials
22 laws.

23 (2) TRANSFER OF ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDIC-
24 TION.—

1 (A) BLM LAND PARCEL A.—Administra-
2 tive jurisdiction over BLM land parcel A is
3 transferred from the Bureau of Land Manage-
4 ment to the National Park Service.

5 (B) BLM LAND PARCEL B.—Administra-
6 tive jurisdiction over BLM land parcel B is
7 transferred from the Bureau of Land Manage-
8 ment to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

9 (C) BIA LAND.—Administrative jurisdic-
10 tion over the BIA land is transferred from the
11 Bureau of Indian Affairs to the National Park
12 Service.

13 (D) NPS LAND.—Administrative jurisdic-
14 tion over the NPS land is transferred from the
15 National Park Service to the Bureau of Indian
16 Affairs.

17 (c) ADMINISTRATION; BOUNDARY MODIFICATION.—
18 On the acquisition of land or an interest in land under
19 subsection (a), and with respect to any land transferred
20 by subsection (b), the Secretary shall—

21 (1) administer the land or interest in land ac-
22 quired under subsection (a) or the land transferred
23 to the administrative jurisdiction of the National
24 Park Service under subparagraph (A) or (C) of sub-
25 section (b)(2), as applicable, as part of the Monu-

1 ment, in accordance with the laws generally applica-
2 ble to units of the National Park System, including
3 applicable provisions of division A of subtitle I of
4 title 54, United States Code; and

5 (2) modify the boundary of the Monument to
6 reflect, as applicable—

7 (A) the acquisition of land or interest in
8 land under subsection (a); and

9 (B) the transfer of administrative jurisdic-
10 tion under subsection (b).

11 (d) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file
12 and available for inspection in the appropriate offices of
13 the National Park Service.

14 (e) COMPENSATION.—Except in a case in which land
15 or an interest in land is acquired by donation under sub-
16 section (a), as consideration for the acquisition of land or
17 an interest in land under that subsection, the Secretary
18 shall—

19 (1) pay fair market value for the land or inter-
20 est in land; or

21 (2) convey to the State or private landowner, as
22 applicable, Federal land or an interest in Federal
23 land of equal value located in the State.

1 **SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF STATE LAND.**

2 The Secretary may enter into an agreement with the
3 State to provide for the cooperative management by the
4 Secretary and the State of the approximately 200 acres
5 of State land, as generally depicted on the map as “State
6 land of Arizona”.

7 **SEC. 6. DON YOUNG LEGACY NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL**
8 **STUDY.**

9 *Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16*
10 *U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-*
11 *lowing:*

12 “(48) *DON YOUNG LEGACY TRAIL.*—

13 “(A) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Don Young Legacy*
14 *Trail, extending approximately 500 miles from*
15 *Seward, Alaska, to Fairbanks, Alaska.*

16 “(B) *REQUIREMENT.*—*The Secretary of the*
17 *Interior, acting through the Director of the Bu-*
18 *reau of Land Management (referred to in this*
19 *paragraph as the ‘Secretary’), shall study the*
20 *feasibility of designating the trail described in*
21 *subparagraph (A), including evaluating the po-*
22 *tential impacts of the trail on rights-of-way, ex-*
23 *isting rights, or other recreational uses of the*
24 *land proposed to be used for the trail.*

1 “(C) *CONSULTATION.*—*The Secretary shall*
2 *conduct the study under this paragraph in con-*
3 *sultation with—*

4 “(i) *the Secretary of Agriculture, act-*
5 *ing through the Chief of the Forest Service;*

6 “(ii) *the State of Alaska;*

7 “(iii) *units of local government in the*
8 *State of Alaska;*

9 “(iv) *Alaska Native Corporations; and*

10 “(v) *representatives of the private sec-*
11 *tor, including any entity that holds a per-*
12 *mit issued by the Federal Energy Regu-*
13 *latory Commission.”.*

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
