A BILL

To prohibit the Administrator of General Services from establishing per diem reimbursements rates for travel within the continental United States (commonly known as “CONUS”) for certain fiscal years below a certain level, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Restored, Equitable,
5 Coronavirus Adjusted Lodging Act of 2021” or the
6 “RECAL Act of 2021”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES (CONUS) PER DIEM**
2 **REIMBURSEMENT RATES.**

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in estab-
4 lishing the per diem reimbursement rates for fiscal years
5 2022 and 2023 pursuant to sections 5702 and 5707 of
6 title 5, United States Code, the Administrator of General
7 Services may not establish a lodging allowance rate for
8 any location within the continental United States at a level
9 that is less than the standard rate or non-standard area
10 rate set pursuant to the GSA Per Diem Bulletin FTR 20–
11 01, dated August 8, 2019.

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
