1 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON REQUIRING COVID-19 VAC-**
2 **CINATION AS A CONDITION OF RECEIVING**
3 **SOCIAL SECURITY OR SUPPLEMENTAL SECU-**
4 **RITY INCOME BENEFITS.**

5 Neither the Commissioner of Social Security nor any
6 officer or employee of the Social Security Administration
7 shall establish or enforce any requirement that an indi-
8 vidual receive a COVID-19 vaccine as a condition of re-
9 ceiving a benefit under title II or XVI of the Social Secu-
10 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 401 et seq.; 1381 et seq.).

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
