A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study on the feasibility of designating the Buckeye Trail as a national scenic trail, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Buckeye National Sce-
5 nic Trail Feasibility Study Act of 2022”.

1 **SEC. 2. BUCKEYE NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL FEASIBILITY**
2 **STUDY.**

3 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
4 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
5 lowing:

6 “(48) BUCKEYE TRAIL.—The Buckeye Trail, a
7 system of trails creating a loop extending approxi-
8 mately 1,454 miles from Lake Erie to the Ohio
9 River, through the farmland of northwest Ohio, the
10 hills of Appalachia, the Black Hand sandstone cliffs
11 of the Hocking Hills region, and the Bluegrass re-
12 gion of southwest Ohio.”.

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
