Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on Intelligence.

Mr. WARNER, from the Select Committee on Intelligence, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on
Intelligence.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORITY.**

3 In carrying out its powers, duties, and functions
4 under S. Res. 400 (94th Congress), agreed to May 19,
5 1976, as amended by S. Res. 445 (108th Congress),
6 agreed to October 9, 2004, in accordance with its jurisdic-
7 tion under sections 3(a) and 17 of such S. Res. 400, in-
8 cluding holding hearings, reporting such hearings, and
9 making investigations as authorized by section 5 of such
10 S. Res. 400, the Select Committee on Intelligence (in this

1 resolution referred to as the “committee”) is authorized
 2 from March 1, 2021 through February 28, 2023, in its
 3 discretion, to—

4 (1) make expenditures from the contingent fund
 5 of the Senate;

6 (2) employ personnel; and

7 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
 8 department or agency concerned and the Committee
 9 on Rules and Administration, use on a reimbursable
 10 or nonreimbursable basis the services of personnel of
 11 any such department or agency.

12 **SEC. 2. EXPENSES.**

13 (a) EXPENSES FOR PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30,
 14 2021.—The expenses of the committee for the period
 15 March 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021 under this
 16 resolution shall not exceed \$4,078,193, of which amount
 17 not to exceed \$10,000 may be expended for the procure-
 18 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
 19 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
 20 lative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

21 (b) EXPENSES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022 PERIOD.—
 22 The expenses of the committee for the period October 1,
 23 2021 through September 30, 2022 under this resolution
 24 shall not exceed \$6,991,188, of which amount not to ex-
 25 ceed \$17,144 may be expended for the procurement of the

1 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
 2 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
 3 nization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

4 (c) EXPENSES FOR PERIOD ENDING FEBRUARY 28,
 5 2023.—The expenses of the committee for the period Oc-
 6 tober 1, 2022 through February 28, 2023 under this reso-
 7 lution shall not exceed \$2,912,995, of which amount not
 8 to exceed \$7,143 may be expended for the procurement
 9 of the services of individual consultants, or organizations
 10 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
 11 Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

12 **SEC. 3. EXPENSES AND AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.**

13 (a) EXPENSES OF THE COMMITTEE.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
 15 graph (2), expenses of the committee under this res-
 16 olution shall be paid from the contingent fund of the
 17 Senate upon vouchers approved by the chairman of
 18 the committee.

19 (2) VOUCHERS NOT REQUIRED.—Vouchers shall
 20 not be required for—

21 (A) the disbursement of salaries of employ-
 22 ees paid at an annual rate;

23 (B) the payment of telecommunications
 24 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms
 25 and Doorkeeper;

1 (C) the payment of stationery supplies pur-
 2 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery;

3 (D) payments to the Postmaster of the
 4 Senate;

5 (E) the payment of metered charges on
 6 copying equipment provided by the Office of the
 7 Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper;

8 (F) the payment of Senate Recording and
 9 Photographic Services; or

10 (G) the payment of franked and mass mail
 11 costs by the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper.

12 (b) AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.—There are authorized
 13 to be paid from the appropriations account for “Expenses
 14 of Inquiries and Investigations” of the Senate such sums
 15 as may be necessary for agency contributions related to
 16 the compensation of employees of the committee—

17 (1) for the period March 1, 2021 through Sep-
 18 tember 30, 2021;

19 (2) for the period October 1, 2021 through Sep-
 20 tember 30, 2022; and

21 (3) for the period October 1, 2022 through
 22 February 28, 2023.

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
