AN ACT

To amend the Taiwan Allies International Protection and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI) Act of 2019 to provide that the United States, as a member of any international organizations, should oppose any attempts by the People's Republic of China to resolve Taiwan's status by distorting the decisions, language, policies, or procedures of the organization, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Taiwan International
5 Solidarity Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION REGARDING UNITED NATIONS GEN-**
7 **ERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 2758 (XXVI).**

8 Subsection (a) of section 2 of the Taiwan Allies Inter-
9 national Protection and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI)
10 Act of 2019 (Public Law 116–135) (relating to diplomatic
11 relations with Taiwan) is amended by adding at the end
12 the following new paragraphs:

13 “(10) United Nations General Assembly Reso-
14 lution 2758 (XXVI) established the representatives
15 of the Government of the People’s Republic of China
16 as the only lawful representatives of China to the
17 United Nations. The resolution did not address the
18 issue of representation of Taiwan and its people in
19 the United Nations or any related organizations, nor
20 did the resolution take a position on the relationship
21 between the People’s Republic of China and Taiwan
22 or include any statement pertaining to Taiwan’s sov-
23 ereignty.

1 “(11) The United States opposes any initiative
2 that seeks to change Taiwan’s status without the
3 consent of the people.”.

4 **SEC. 3. UNITED STATES ADVOCACY FOR INTERNATIONAL**
5 **ORGANIZATIONS TO RESIST THE PEOPLE’S**
6 **REPUBLIC OF CHINA’S EFFORTS TO DISTORT**
7 **THE “ONE CHINA” POSITION.**

8 Section 4 of the Taiwan Allies International Protec-
9 tion and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI) Act of 2019
10 (relating to the policy of the United States regarding Tai-
11 wan’s participation in international organizations) is
12 amended—

13 (1) in paragraph (3), by striking “and” after
14 the semicolon at the end;

15 (2) in paragraph (4), by striking the period at
16 the end and inserting “; and”; and

17 (3) by adding at the end the following new
18 paragraph:

19 “(5) to instruct, as appropriate, representatives
20 of the United States Government in all organizations
21 described in paragraph (1) to use the voice, vote,
22 and influence of the United States to advocate such
23 organizations to resist the People’s Republic of Chi-
24 na’s efforts to distort the decisions, language, poli-

1 cies, or procedures of such organizations regarding
2 Taiwan.”.

3 **SEC. 4. OPPOSING THE PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA’S**
4 **EFFORTS TO UNDERMINE TAIWAN’S TIES AND**
5 **PARTNERSHIPS INTERNATIONALLY.**

6 Subsection (a) of section 5 of the Taiwan Allies Inter-
7 national Protection and Enhancement Initiative (TAIPEI)
8 Act of 2019 (relating to strengthening ties with Taiwan)
9 is amended—

10 (1) in paragraph (3), by striking “and” after
11 the semicolon at the end;

12 (2) in paragraph (4), by striking the period at
13 the end and inserting “; and”; and

14 (3) by adding at the end the following new
15 paragraph:

16 “(5) encourage, as appropriate, United States
17 allies and partners to oppose the People’s Republic
18 of China’s efforts to undermine Taiwan’s official
19 diplomatic relationships and its partnerships with
20 countries with which it does not maintain diplomatic
21 relations.”.

1 **SEC. 5. REPORT ON THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA'S**
2 **ATTEMPTS TO PROMOTE ITS "ONE CHINA"**
3 **POSITION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (b) of section 5 of the
5 Taiwan Allies International Protection and Enhancement
6 Initiative (TAIPEI) Act of 2019 (relating to strength-
7 ening ties with Taiwan) is amended by inserting before
8 the period at the end the following: “, as well as informa-
9 tion relating to any prior or ongoing attempts by the Peo-
10 ple’s Republic of China to undermine Taiwan’s member-
11 ship or observer status in all organizations described in
12 section (4)(1) and Taiwan’s ties and relationships with
13 other countries in accordance with subsection (a) of this
14 section”.

15 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
16 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date of the enact-
17 ment of this Act and apply beginning with the first report
18 required under subsection (b) of section 5 of the Taiwan
19 Allies International Protection and Enhancement Initia-
20 tive (TAIPEI) Act of 2019, as amended by subsection (a),
21 that is required after such date.
