Ms. FOXX (for herself and Mr. FALLON) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 with respect to crime victim compensation program eligibility, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Justice for Victims
5 of Open Borders Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION.**

7 Section 1403(b) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984
8 (34 U.S.C. 20102) is amended—

9 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “is operated
10 by a State and”;

1 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (2) through
2 (10) as paragraphs (4) through (12), respectively;
3 and

4 (3) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
5 lowing:

6 “(2) such program is operated by a State for
7 which the State’s Attorney General has certified to
8 the Attorney General that the program—

9 “(A) prioritizes making payments to vic-
10 tims of crimes committed by an alien who was
11 unlawfully present in the United States at the
12 time of the commission of the crime; and

13 “(B) does not prioritize making payments
14 to victims of crimes committed by a person
15 whose status under the immigration laws (as
16 such term is defined in section 101 of the Im-
17 migration and Nationality Act) is unknown;

18 “(3) such program does not provide compensa-
19 tion to any alien unlawfully present in the United
20 States;”.

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
