AN ACT

To amend section 102(a)(20) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 to require the exclusion of service-connected disability compensation when determining whether a person is a person of low and moderate income, a person of low income, or a person of moderate income, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Disabled Veterans
5 Housing Support Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. SERVICE CONNECTED DISABILITY COMPENSATION.**

7 Section 102(a)(20) of the Housing and Community
8 Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5302(a)(20)) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following:

10 “(C) SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY
11 COMPENSATION.—When determining whether a
12 person is a person of low and moderate income,
13 a person of low income, or a person of moderate
14 income under this paragraph, a State, unit of
15 general local government, or Indian tribe shall
16 exclude any service-connected disability com-
17 pensation received by such person from the De-
18 partment of Veterans Affairs.”.

19 **SEC. 3. REPORT.**

20 The Comptroller General of the United States shall,
21 not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of
22 this Act, submit to the Congress a report that—

23 (1) examines how service-connected disability
24 compensation is treated for the purposes of deter-

1 mining eligibility for all programs administered by
2 the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development;

3 (2) identifies any instances where service-con-
4 nected disability compensation is treated in a man-
5 ner inconsistent with the amendment made by sec-
6 tion 2; and

7 (3) with respect to each program administered
8 by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-
9 ment in which service-connected disability compensa-
10 tion is treated inconsistently, provides legislative rec-
11 ommendations relating to how such program could
12 better serve veteran populations, and under-served
13 communities.
