AN ACT

To require the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection to establish procedures for conducting maintenance projects at ports of entry at which the Office of Field Operations conducts certain enforcement and facilitation activities.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Reducing Excessive
5 Vetting Authorities to Maintain our Ports Act” or the
6 “REVAMP Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. PORT MAINTENANCE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 411(o) of the Homeland
9 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 211(o)) is amended—

1 (1) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-
2 graph (4); and

3 (2) by inserting after paragraph (2) the fol-
4 lowing new paragraph:

5 “(3) PORT MAINTENANCE.—

6 “(A) PROCEDURES.—

7 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding
8 section 3305 of title 40, United States
9 Code, subject to subparagraph (B), the
10 Commissioner, in consultation with the Ad-
11 ministrators of General Services—

12 “(I) shall establish guidance and
13 procedures by which U.S. Customs
14 and Border Protection may conduct
15 maintenance and repair projects cost-
16 ing not more than \$300,000 in the
17 physical space at any Federal Govern-
18 ment-owned port of entry at which the
19 Office of Field Operations performs
20 any of the activities described in sub-
21 paragraphs (A) through (G) of sub-
22 section (g)(3); and

23 “(II) is authorized to perform
24 such maintenance and repair projects,

1 subject to the procedures described in
2 clause (ii).

3 “(ii) GUIDANCE AND PROCEDURES
4 DESCRIBED.—The guidance and proce-
5 dures established pursuant to clause (i)
6 shall include—

7 “(I) a description of the types of
8 projects that may be carried out pur-
9 suant to clause (i); and

10 “(II) the procedures for identi-
11 fying and addressing any impacts on
12 other tenants of facilities where such
13 projects will be carried out.

14 “(iii) PUBLICATION OF GUIDANCE
15 AND PROCEDURES.—The guidance and
16 procedures established pursuant to clause
17 (i) shall be published in the Federal Reg-
18 ister.

19 “(iv) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—The
20 publication of guidance and procedures
21 under clause (iii) shall not impact the au-
22 thority of the Commissioner to update such
23 procedures, in consultation with the Ad-
24 ministrator, as appropriate.

1 “(B) LIMITATION.—The authority under
2 subparagraph (A) shall only be available for
3 maintenance and repair projects involving exist-
4 ing infrastructure, property, and capital at any
5 port of entry described in such subparagraph.

6 “(C) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing
7 in this paragraph may be construed to affect
8 the availability of funding from—

9 “(i) the Federal Buildings Fund es-
10 tablished under section 592 of title 40,
11 United States Code;

12 “(ii) the Donation Acceptance Pro-
13 gram established under section 482; or

14 “(iii) any other statutory authority or
15 appropriation for projects described in sub-
16 paragraph (A).”.

17 (b) REPORTING.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year
19 after the date of the enactment of this Act and an-
20 nually thereafter, the Commissioner of U.S. Customs
21 and Border Protection shall submit to the Com-
22 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
23 fairs of the Senate, the Committee on Appropria-
24 tions of the Senate, the Committee on Homeland Se-
25 curity of the House of Representatives, and the

1 Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
2 resentatives a report that includes the elements de-
3 scribed in paragraph (2).

4 (2) ELEMENTS.—The elements described in
5 this paragraph are the following:

6 (A) A summary of all maintenance projects
7 conducted pursuant to section 411(o)(3) of the
8 Homeland Security Act of 2002, as added by
9 subsection (a) during the prior fiscal year.

10 (B) Information relating to the cost of
11 each project referred to in subparagraph (A) of
12 such section.

13 (C) An identification of the account that
14 funded each such project, if applicable.

15 (D) any budgetary transfers, if applicable,
16 that funded each such project.

17 (c) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section 422(a) of the
18 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 232(a)) is
19 amended by inserting “section 411(o)(3) of this Act and”
20 after “Administrator under”.
