Mr. GIMENEZ (for himself and Mr. MENENDEZ) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

A BILL

To require an assessment by the Department of Homeland Security regarding threats within the United States posed by the Republic of Cuba, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Cuba Threat Assess-
5 ment Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. ASSESSMENT ON THREATS WITHIN THE UNITED**
7 **STATES POSED BY THE REPUBLIC OF CUBA.**

8 (a) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180 days after
9 the date of the enactment of this Act and annually there-

1 after for five years, the Under Secretary for Intelligence
2 and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security,
3 in consultation with the heads of other relevant Federal
4 departments or agencies as the Under Secretary deter-
5 mines appropriate, shall submit to the appropriate con-
6 gressional committees an assessment regarding threats
7 within the United States posed by the Republic of Cuba.

8 (b) COORDINATION.—The threat assessments under
9 subsection (a)—

10 (1) shall be coordinated with the Office of the
11 General Counsel, the Privacy Office, and the Office
12 for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Depart-
13 ment of Homeland Security prior to release outside
14 the Department to ensure each such assessment
15 complies with applicable law and protects individ-
16 uals' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties; and

17 (2) may be informed by existing products, as
18 appropriate.

19 (c) FORM.—The threat assessments under subsection
20 (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may in-
21 clude a classified annex. The Under Secretary for Intel-
22 ligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Se-
23 curity shall post on a publicly available website of the De-
24 partment an unclassified portion of such assessments.

1 (d) BRIEFING.—Not later than 30 days after the sub-
2 mission of each threat assessment under subsection (a),
3 the Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis of the
4 Department of Homeland Security shall provide to the ap-
5 propriate congressional committees a briefing regarding
6 each such assessment. The head of any other Federal rel-
7 evant department or agency referred to in such subsection
8 shall join the Under Secretary for any such briefing if any
9 such committee determines such is appropriate.

10 (e) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
11 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-
12 sional committees” means the Committee on Homeland
13 Security and the Permanent Select Committee on Intel-
14 ligence of the House of Representatives, and the Com-
15 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
16 and the Select Committee on Intelligence of the Senate.

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
