Mr. WHITEHOUSE (for himself, Mr. GRASSLEY, and Mr. WYDEN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the exclusion of Pell Grants from gross income.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tax-Free Pell Grant
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF PELL GRANT EXCLUSION FROM**
7 **GROSS INCOME.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 117(b)(1) of the Internal
9 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by striking “received

1 by an individual” and all that follows and inserting “re-
 2 ceived by an individual—

3 “(A) as a scholarship or fellowship grant
 4 to the extent the individual establishes that, in
 5 accordance with the conditions of the grant,
 6 such amount was used for qualified tuition and
 7 related expenses, or

8 “(B) as a Federal Pell Grant under section
 9 401 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (as
 10 in effect on the date of the enactment of the
 11 Tax-Free Pell Grant Act).”.

12 (b) NO ADJUSTMENT UNDER AMERICAN OPPOR-
 13 TUNITY AND LIFETIME LEARNING CREDITS.—Section
 14 25A(g)(2)(A) of such Code is amended by inserting
 15 “(other than a Federal Pell Grant under section 401 of
 16 the Higher Education Act of 1965 (as in effect on the
 17 date of the enactment of the Tax-Free Pell Grant Act))”
 18 after “section 117”.

19 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
 20 this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
 21 December 31, 2022.

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
