A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to authorize grants for training and support services for families and caregivers of people living with Alzheimer’s disease or a related dementia.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Alzheimer’s Caregiver
5 Support Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. GRANTS FOR TRAINING AND SUPPORT SERVICES**
 2 **FOR FAMILIES AND CAREGIVERS OF PEOPLE**
 3 **LIVING WITH ALZHEIMER’S DISEASE OR A RE-**
 4 **LATED DEMENTIA.**

5 Subpart I of part D of title III of the Public Health
 6 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254b et seq.) is amended by adding
 7 at the end the following:

8 **“SEC. 330Q. GRANTS FOR TRAINING AND SUPPORT SERV-**
 9 **ICES FOR FAMILIES AND CAREGIVERS OF**
 10 **PEOPLE LIVING WITH ALZHEIMER’S DISEASE**
 11 **OR A RELATED DEMENTIA.**

12 “(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

13 “(1) AREA AGENCY ON AGING.—The term ‘area
 14 agency on aging’ has the meaning given the term in
 15 section 102 of the Older Americans Act of 1965.

16 “(2) MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED COMMUNITY.—
 17 The term ‘medically underserved community’ has the
 18 meaning given the term in section 799B.

19 “(b) GRANTS.—The Secretary may award grants to
 20 public or nonprofit private health care providers described
 21 in subsection (c) for the purpose of expanding training
 22 and support services for families and caregivers of people
 23 living with Alzheimer’s disease or a related dementia if
 24 such health care providers—

25 “(1) meet the conditions for receiving grants
 26 under subsection (d); and

1 “(2) submit an application to the Secretary in
2 such form, in such manner, and containing such
3 agreements, assurances, and information as the Sec-
4 retary may reasonably require.

5 “(c) RECIPIENTS OF GRANTS.—The public or non-
6 profit private health care providers described in this sub-
7 section include—

8 “(1) health care organizations;

9 “(2) community health centers;

10 “(3) nursing homes;

11 “(4) senior centers;

12 “(5) area agencies on aging;

13 “(6) community-based organizations;

14 “(7) organizations providing support services
15 for families and caregivers of patients with younger-
16 onset Alzheimer’s disease or a related dementia; and

17 “(8) State, local, and Tribal public health agen-
18 cies and social service agencies.

19 “(d) CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING GRANTS.—To be
20 eligible to receive a grant awarded under subsection (b),
21 a public or nonprofit health care provider described in sub-
22 section (c) shall agree—

23 “(1) to employ a comprehensive approach to
24 caring for patients with Alzheimer’s disease or a re-
25 lated dementia that integrates treatment of such pa-

1 tients with training and support services for the
2 families and caregivers of such patients;

3 “(2) in any program to be funded by a grant
4 awarded under subsection (b), that services will be
5 provided in the languages most appropriate for, and
6 with consideration for the cultural backgrounds of,
7 the individuals for whom the services are provided;
8 and

9 “(3) to provide outreach activities to inform the
10 public of the services of the program, and to provide
11 information on Alzheimer’s disease and related de-
12 mentias to the public.

13 “(e) COORDINATION.—The Secretary shall coordinate
14 with the Director of the Office on Women’s Health and
15 the Director of the Office of Minority Health in order to
16 ensure that women, minorities, and patients who live in
17 medically underserved communities are able to benefit
18 from the training and support services funded through
19 grants awarded under subsection (b).

20 “(f) FUNDING.—

21 “(1) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
22 For the purpose of carrying out this section, there
23 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may
24 be necessary for each of fiscal years 2026 through
25 2028.

1 “(2) ALLOCATION FOR MEDICALLY UNDER-
2 SERVED COMMUNITIES.—Of the amounts appro-
3 priated under paragraph (1) for a fiscal year, the
4 Secretary shall make available not less than 10 per-
5 cent for grants awarded under subsection (b) to pub-
6 lic or nonprofit private health care providers that
7 primarily serve medically underserved communities
8 and meet the requirements under this section.”.

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
