Whereas Representative Swalwell has not denied other troublesome elements of public

Whereas clause 1 of rule XXIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives provides, "A Member, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, officer, or employee of the House shall behave at all times in a manner that shall reflect creditably on the House."; and

Whereas Representative Eric should be removed from his committee assignment in light of conduct he has exhibited: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the following named Member be, and is hereby, removed from the fol-lowing committee of the House of Representatives:

PERMANENT SELECT COMMITTEE ON INTEL-LIGENCE: Mr. Swalwell of California.
