Over her 15 years in my office, she has been an outstanding mentor and role model to many, particularly young women. She has dedicated her service to this truth, as I always say: "When women succeed. America succeeds.'

Diane's love of the arts is well known. She has represented my office in our work with leading cultural institutions, including the Smithsonian, the Kennedy Center, the Library of Congress, the National Archives, and the National Gallery of Art. Given her passion and experience in this arena, it is fitting that she is leaving Capitol Hill for the National Endowment for the Arts.

Inscribed in the marble facade of the Kennedy Center are President John F. Kennedy's powerful words: "The life of the arts, far from being an interruption, a distraction, in the life of the nation, is very close to the center of a nation's purpose . . . and is a test of the quality of a nation's civilization.'

At the NEA, Diane's passion for the "life of the arts" will serve this Nation's purpose well.

INVESTING IN A NEW VISION FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND SURFACE TRANSPORTATION IN AMERICA ACT

H.R. 3684

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

This Act may be cited as the "Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Surface Transportation in America Act" or the "IN-VEST in America Act".
