CONGRESSIONAL RYDER CUP

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TRAINING FOR THE ACQUISITION WORKFORCE ACT

The SPEAKER pro tempore. S. 3655. An ACT to amend the Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection Act of 2018 to extend the termination date of the Civil Rights Cold Case Records Review Board.

S. 3875. An ACT to require the President to develop and maintain products that show the risk of natural hazards across the United States, and for other purposes.

S. 3906. An ACT to improve certain programs of the Small Business Administration to better assist small business customers in accessing broadband technology, and for other purposes.

S. 4166. An ACT to authorize preparedness programs to support communities containing technological hazards and emerging threats.

S. 5002. An ACT to allow for alternatives to animal testing for purposes of drug and biological product applications.
