The SPEAKER pro tempore. The objections of the President will be spreadat large upon the Journal, and the veto message and the joint resolution will be printed as a House document.

Without objection, further consideration of the veto message and the joint resolution, H.J. Res. 42, is postponed until the legislative day of June 13, 2023.
