Whereas, instances of anti-Arab hate and Islamophobia have been on the rise, including the hate-fueled murder of Wadea Al-Fayoume, a 6-year-old Palestinian American who was stabbed to death in his home in Illinois on October 15, 2023, because of his identity;

Whereas. Representative Mast's comments regarding innocent Palestinian civilians in Gaza are dehumanizing, inflammatory, unacceptable. and can be reasonably construed as inviting the targeted murder of innocent Palestinians, fanning the flames of violence in the Middle East, and violating the international rules of war:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that Brian Mast be censured.
